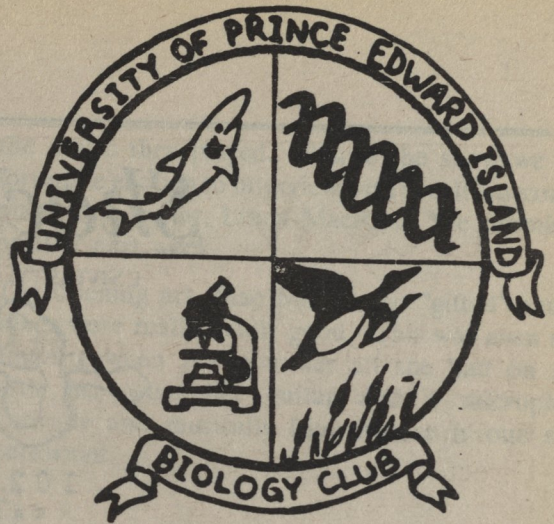


BIOLOGY CLUB
