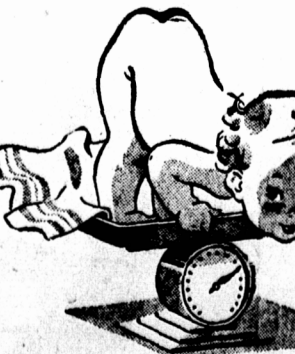
The meeting closed with the singing of "Lifes Railway to Heaven".

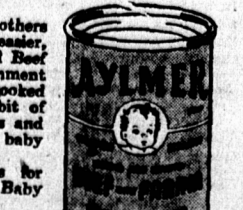

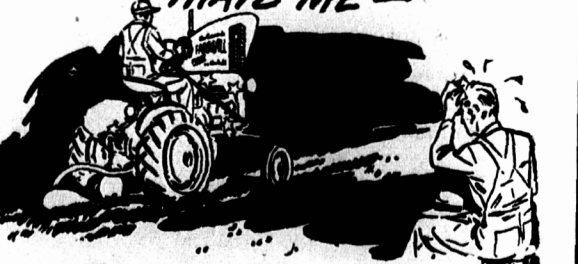
