

Humane Group Report Issued On Seal Hunt

TORONTO (CP) — Most animals inspected by humane society officials during this year's seal hunt in the Gulf of St. Lawrence were incapable of feeling pain before being skinned, but at least 59 did suffer pain before death, says a report issued here.

The report says 59 seals examined Wednesday appeared to have suffered unnecessary pain.

"We found that of these, nine had been struck a blow in the region of the nose or head, and despite loss of blood to a varying degree, these animals were alive, fully conscious and in pain."

The remaining 50 had been slashed by a knife to a varying degree in the region of the throat and chest, resulting in serious wounds and severe bleeding.

The report said tests with a stunning pistol shows this was effective in rendering the animals unconscious or killing them but was impractical in the weather encountered during the hunt.

Until a better method can be developed "a club of proper design, properly used, is the best and most humane method of killing young seals," however, they said.

"We feel that there are economic and sociological reasons for seal hunting to continue, provided that adequate regulations can be drafted and enforced to ensure that all seals are killed or rendered insensitive to pain by a humane method before skinning."

Teacher Runs Unusual Class
 TORONTO (CP) — Teacher Donald Thain, 25, runs an unusual class.

His 30 Grade 6 pupils are unnumbered in the classroom by 50 animals, birds and fish. There is also a collection of ore samples, stuffed birds, paintings and photographs, and a model of the solar system.

Mr. Thain began bringing the world into his classroom five years ago when he started teaching at Wexford public school here.

The menagerie now includes 10 guinea pigs, two hamsters, a cardinal and a Java bird, three fish, about 30 mice, and a lizard named Iggy who eats only fruit cocktail.

On a table rests a glass-topped hive of 20,000 bees, which buzz in and out of a nearby window by way of a tube. The honey goes on crackers for the school's 900 boys and girls.

"I think there's more to teaching than just the run-of-the-mill subjects," says Thain. "And I've always been interested in science."

He has taken his class to the movies and to visit fairs and a scientific observatory. The school gives him a free hand in his program.

Close Ties With France Are Urged
 (MONTREAL (CP) — Canada's relations with France should be as close and effective as with Great Britain, the United States and Commonwealth countries, External Affairs Minister Paul Martin said here.

He told the University of Montreal's International Relations Club a high-level government and business mission will go to France later this year, followed by a parliamentary delegation. Their purpose will be to encourage closer cultural, diplomatic and trade ties.

"It is important that we should not think of the relationship only in cultural terms, or only in terms of the natural affinities of French-speaking Canadians," Mr. Martin said.

"We are accustomed to thinking of close relations with Britain and the Commonwealth and with the United States as covering many fields and as being of benefit to Canada as a whole. I see relations with France in the same way."

case the initial line of play he forms goes wrong.

South adopted the right course of play in this hand and came out well at the end. Having won the jack of diamonds with the king, he realized that all he had to do to make the contract was to win four club tricks without permitting East to come into the lead for a diamond return.

Accordingly, he led a low club to the queen at trick two. West producing the ten, and continuing with a club towards his hand. When East followed with the six, South played the eight. West showing out. It was then an easy matter to cash ten tricks and make the contract.

Note that it would not have helped East to play the nine on the second club lead. Had he done this, South would have won with the king and later finessed against the jack to produce the same ten tricks.

Note also that if the early club finesse had lost to the nine or jack — which South might well expect to happen — he would still have been certain of nine tricks as a result of the safety finesse. South's main concern in the hand was to keep East out of the lead, and the deep club finesse was made to order to prevent this from happening.

Bald Eagles Seen Harmed By Pollution
 VANCOUVER (CP) — David Hancock, 27, has chased eagles with a single-engine aircraft, but he still doesn't know where they go when they migrate.

However, he thinks he can answer an important question — the reason for the dwindling bald eagle population in the United States.

It's a direct result of pollution of the Great Lakes, says the bearded University of British Columbia student.

The giant birds are scavengers, living on fish carcasses and other animals washed ashore, says Thain. Consequently, they now consume large quantities of poisonous chemicals.

Men are the bald eagle's direct enemies as well, when armed with a hunting rifle or near the eyries, Thain believes.

done by the mother bird, leaving the fledglings to starve.

The bald eagle is the United States' national bird, but the largest colony numbers only 250, in Florida. By contrast, one of Thain's favorite observation areas, Barkley Sound on Vancouver Island, has 170 nests. He thinks there are about 10,000 in British Columbia and the Yukon.

Thain has been studying the bald eagle for three years, with partial sponsorship by the Canadian Audubon Society, for a master's degree in zoology. His wife Lyn accompanies him in observation flights along the British Columbia coast.

There have been reports of eagles migrating in hundreds along the Fraser Valley, he says, but he has never observed this.


