Mr. and Mrs. MacLean, Rosebank, were guests of Laughlin MacLean on Sunday.

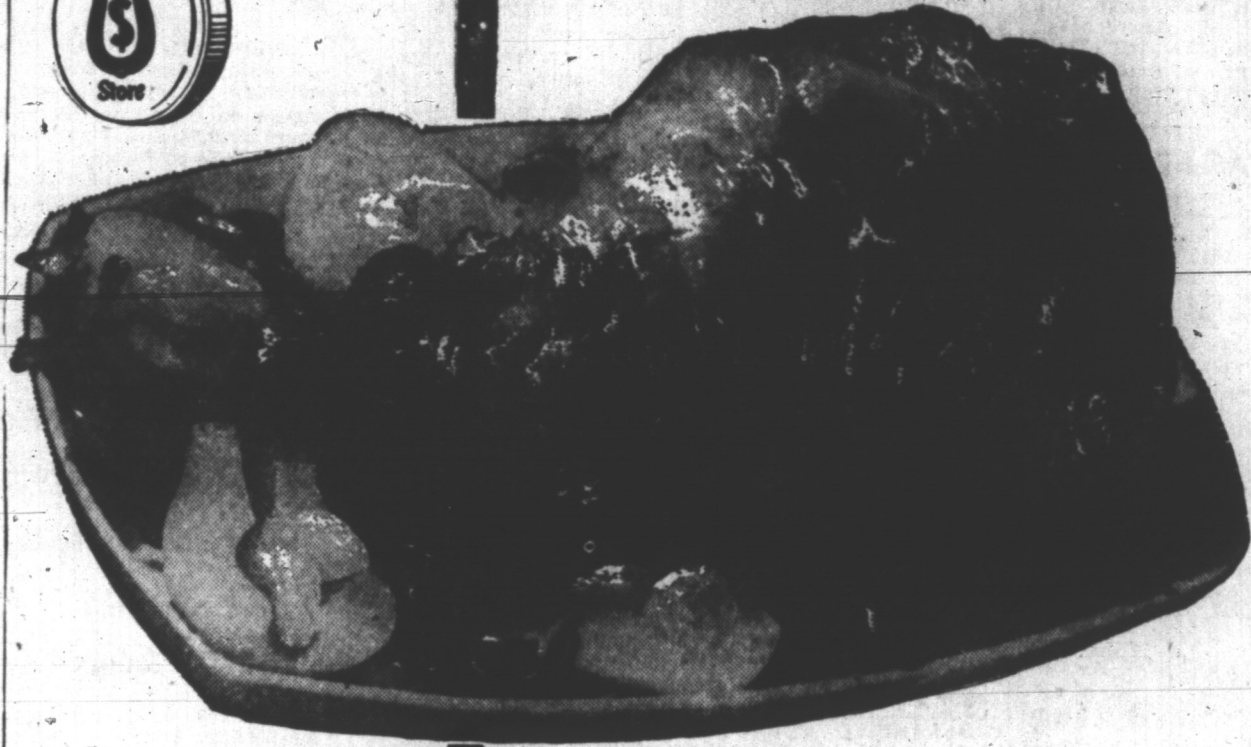
**BALTIC**

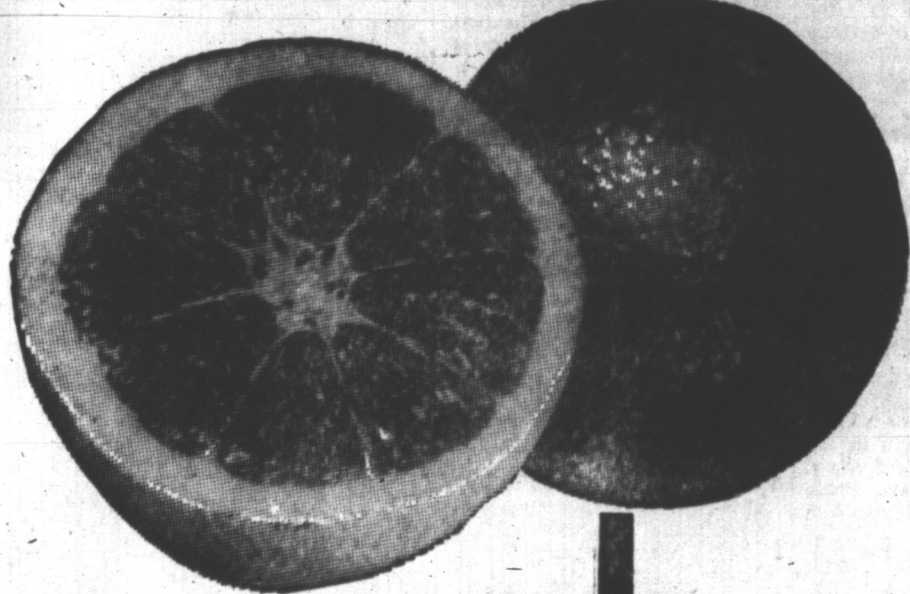
