Campobello Park Opened in Memory Of Roosevelt

CAMPOBELLO ISLAND, N.B.—The wives of the leaders of the Canadian and United States governments officially opened Campobello Park International Park here Thursday.

Mr. Lester B. Pearson, wife of Canada's prime minister and Mrs. Eleanor Roosevelt, wife of President John F. Kennedy, together cut the bright red ribbon on the doors of the 34-room "cottage" which was the summer home of late President Franklin D. Roosevelt.

The former Roosevelt home on this resort island near the Maine-New Brunswick border is situated on 8½ acres of land. The most recent owner of the property, Dr. Armand Hammer and his family, donated it to the Canadian and U.S. governments as a memorial to President Roosevelt.

Franklin D. Roosevelt Jr., was present at the ceremony honoring his father during which Dr. Hammer presented deeds to the six U.S. and Canadian commissioners who will operate the park as an international historic site.

In a voice husky with emotion, Mr. Roosevelt spoke of his father's battle with polio during the time he lived on the New Brunswick island. Mr. Roosevelt, who was born on Campobello, said: "Here we learned the warmth a large family can bring."

He said the international park would be "a symbol of what our accounts can mean to the peace of the world."

The ceremonies, held on the front lawn of the rambling five-year-old mansion, were attended by a crowd of more than 1,000 people, including 100 visitors from both Canada and the U.S., island residents and tourists.

Under sunny skies, the band of the Royal Canadian Dragoons played light popular music as the crowd gathered, then played Yellow Rose of Texas as Mrs. Johnson arrived at the Roosevelt home.

The wife of the U.S. president, wearing a pale orange coat over a pink silk dress, drew warm applause as she paid tribute to President Roosevelt.

"As an American, the Journey to Campobello must always be partly a pilgrimage for me. It was here, among these bays and books and boats, that the life of a president took place. In all of Franklin Roosevelt's accounts of his summers here, he speaks of his reservoirs of exuberance, strength and vitality which summers on Campobello helped to overflowing."

Mrs. Pearson welcomed Mrs. Johnson to Campobello and said: "Although Franklin Roosevelt was not a Canadian, the summers he spent on this Canadian island made it part of him; contributed to shaping his character and his interests."

RECALLS MEMORIES

The wife of the prime minister recalled her personal memories of the late president during his first days of the Second World War.

"I remember listening to his fireside chats to the American people pleading the Allied cause against Nazi Germany and I remember how I prayed that his voice would be heard with understanding and ultimately, with accord."

Mrs. Pearson, who was wearing a navy blue suit with white accessories, travelled to the island by boat from St. Andrews, N.B.

Following the ceremonies, Mrs. Pearson returned to Ottawa by plane. Mrs. Johnson left for informal speaking engagements at Eastport, Me., and Burlington, Vt. Prime Minister Pearson, in a telegram sent to President Johnson earlier Thursday, said it was "most appropriate that our wives are representing us at Campobello, sharing in the cottage ceremony dedicated to the memory of the early days of one of the greatest leaders of our age and, indirectly, to a great and gracious lady, his wife, Eleanor."
