## MARY HAWORTH

### Unhappy Wife Loses Faith After Seeing Psychiatrist

DEAR MARY HAWORTH: I started feeling depressed five years ago and went to a psychiatrist for help. But after three years I was much worse, sick at heart, with problems magnified.

Why? Because the doctor didn't try to reestablish my faith in life and people. In fact, he seemed to lack such faith himself.

In effect he advised me that God is for children, that mature people have no need of this myth that we are all pebbles more or less, on a beach, responsible for ourselves, going it alone.

This idea nearly panicked me. I felt I had to quit him in self-defense. I have been seeing another doctor since, and still feel hopeless at times. This doctor thought a warm person, professes no faith in God either.

I have three children and a hostile, domineering, quick-tempered husband, who made me so miserable I turned to psychiatry to learn how to deal with him.

I was resolved to make my marriage happy, by invoking the necessary changes within myself and, hopefully, in my husband also. When I first sought help, he had already isolated us from relatives and friends, insulating them into avoiding us.

I had supposed that if a person can't find happiness with a mate, he (or she) won't find it elsewhere, because of unsolved inner problems and conflicts. But I've found no guide to help

ness in psychiatry. Rather, the doctors indicate that turning to another is futile; that the solution, if any, is to become an independent self-powered individual, who doesn't need outside reassurance.

If this is so, well, here I am. And where do I go from here? Living has made me cynical and the doctors have fostered this attitude.

Are psychiatrists brainwashing persons who have their defenses down, alienating them from doctrines of faith? They seem to be saying: "Man-made religions and going to church haven't helped you; and they won't. You must find your own strength", etc. What do you say?

DEAR A. C.: There is a folk saying that if you want to pick blackberries, you've got to go where blackberries grow. I should think the same logic

would apply to the person who urgently and sincerely wants reinforced faith in God, when his desperate human quandaries call for a supernatural brand of succor.

And why turn to psychiatry for that kind of help? Psychiatry at best is but an auxiliary form of medical practise. And medical doctors, even the best, in whatever specialty, are humbly willing to admit that, in the event healings occur, it is Nature or Nature's God that prevailed. The doctor at best, can only ready the patient to cooperate with the laws of healing, which laws, in themselves, are quite outside the doctor's power to coerce.

It seems to me that you've been hoping blindly, that one psychiatrist or another might "play God" in your life history by furnishing specific recipes as to just what you should do or say, theoretically, to erase trouble and suffering from your experience.

What you've encountered, instead, are psychiatrists who, being characteristically human and faulty, tend involuntarily to resent your implicit heavy demands upon them, namely, that they pinch-hit for God, in putting your life to rights.

So they strike back, more or less defensively, from subjective depths of vexed resistance by lecturing you, indirectly, on the folly of "faith in God," which they identify, cynically, as being practically on a par with primitive aborigine faith in the witch doctor approach to healing.

As for what to do, if you want your faith revived, instructed, exercised, disciplined and matured up to the level of effective Christianity, go where the reality of this kind of "living faith" is known and understood and practised. In short, go to church.

In your town, as it happens, there is a Pastoral Institute, organized a few years ago, as a top-quality professional fellowship between clergy and psychiatry, to aid church members with thorny problems of family conflict, neurotic disorders and the like. Patients are accepted by the Institute only if referred by the clergy. Ask your pastor to put you in touch. M. H.

**NO INCREASE EXPECTED**  
CHICAGO (AP) — Gardner Ackley, President Johnson's chief economic adviser, ruled out today any immediate U.S. tax increase to arrest inflationary pressures. Ackley said the Johnson administration feels that restraints imposed on the U.S. economy last winter, coupled with the co-operation of industry and labor, will be an adequate hedge. His prepared talk for the annual convention of the Super Market Institute added new assurance that a tax increase is not now part of any administration anti-inflation program.

OTTAWA (CP)—Canadair Ltd. of Montreal has been awarded a \$2,700,000 contract for advanced production engineering of an amphibious military vehicle for the U.S. Army, the defence production department said Wednesday. Design and development of the two-unit tracked carrier is one of the first programs undertaken by Canada under the terms of the Canada-U.S. defence development sharing agreement.

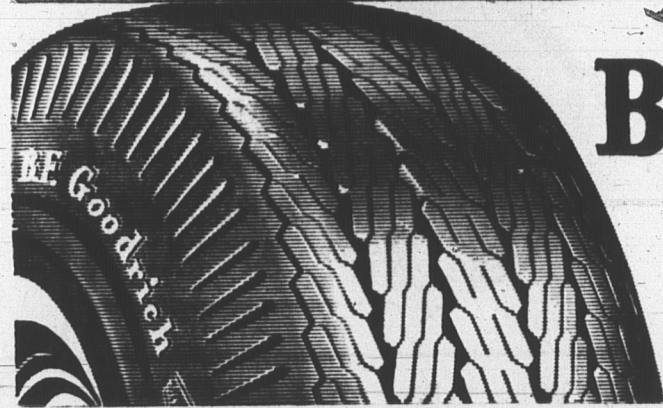

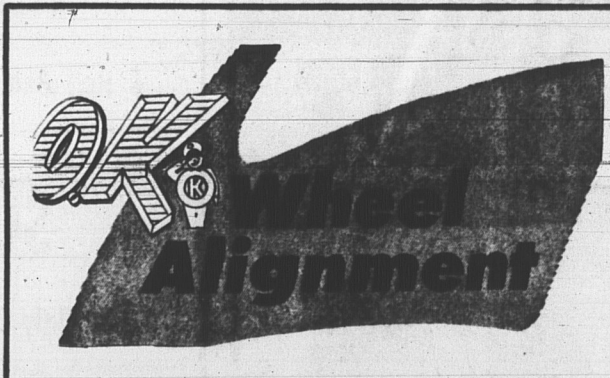

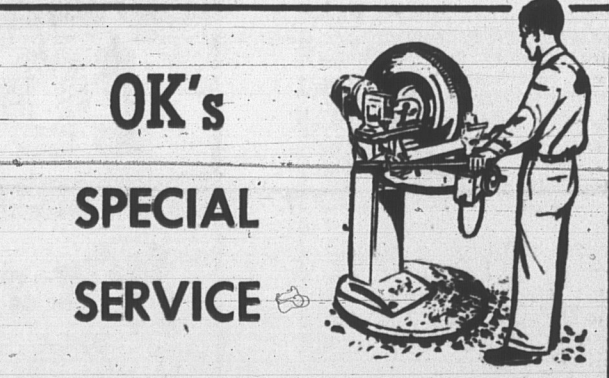
