HUNTERS CORNER

Game Law Infractions Difficult To Pin Down

This past two weeks I have heard complaints voiced by members of the Fish and Game Association regarding the failure of local residents, with special reference to farmers, to furnish information to the R.C.M.P. game officers regarding infractions of our game laws with specific reference to the rash of spring goose shooting that has erupted this spring. I counter with this question: How much definite information have they themselves passed over? I have tried to pry information from a few of them myself well knowing they possessed it. Their answers were a masterpiece of evasiveness. I didn't have the time to get out and dig it up the hard way like I had to do when I was paid for doing it.

HAVE OWN WAY
Farmers have their own way of passing out information. They don't spell it out to you in black letters and scare easily if an attempt is made to pin them down to a specific statement. Here is a case in point: When the police took over the game law enforcement pertaining to this province a farmer of my acquaintance, incensed over a flagrant violation, (spring shooting of wild-geese) decided to do something about it. He contacted the game officer for Queens, who has since been transferred, with the full intention of telling exactly what he saw and knew. The following is a condensed account of what this farmer told me: "Out came the little black book and every word was meticulously jotted down and checked. I had visions of myself standing in the witness box with nothing on but my birthday suit and clammed up quick. Our farmers have their own way of imparting information without committing themselves.

Here is a case in point: In March 1919 I was sworn in as a Federal Migratory Bird Officer at Pisiquid Pond, P.E.I., teamed with black ducks and the hunters in the area opened the season whenever the spirit moved them. In 1930 it was opened on July 9th according to my diary and a duck supper was given by the King of poachers, in honour of guests departing for the States, on July 18th. On August 6th a Provincial Election was held and after casting my vote at Waterville Pond shortly after noon I continued on to Pisiquid Pond. On the slope below Grant's on the Donnelly's Road that overlooks MacDonald's Spring on the west side of the pond I stopped to chat with a hired man harrowing with a team of horses. I learned the following given in his own words in a condensed form: "The dinner horn had just blown and I was unbiting the traces when I heard 4 shots at MacDonald's spring across the pond and saw a black cloud of ducks rise. I watched two men wade out. I saw the sun shining on the drops of water kicked up by their feet. They picked some objects out of the water and then went back to shore and disappeared into the bushes. They were a mile away. I couldn't tell how they were dressed or what they looked like."

I contacted a chap who lived across the Pond who could be in a position to know something about the noon shooting. We sat and chatted while he gave his team their wind. He told me that he didn't hear any shots but he observed the flight of ducks swing over the pond. He didn't pay any attention because they sometimes took exercise flight for no apparent reason. He went on to say: "If I saw anybody shooting I'd tell you because such things are not right at this season of the year." We talked about the election and wondered about what the outcome would be. He queried: "How do you think Russia will make out?" It's hard to tell about Russia but I feel there will be a lot of vacant seats when its over" was my comment.

MUST HAVE PLEASSED
My comment on the election must have pleased him for, as I turned to leave, he queried: "Have you seen H.I.J. lately?" "No, he's in the States." "He came home three weeks ago. He is leaving in the morning." "Where is he staying?" "With his brother G.W." The Model T Roadster headed for there like a homing pigeon. London, a lantern-jawed former British champ with a weight advantage of more than 20 pounds, is regarded so lightly that odds against him have been quoted at 10-1.

If he should up-end Patterson it would be the biggest ring shocker since Joe Louis was knocked out by Max Schmeling in 1936.
RISK OF INJURY
Few expect any startling upset. However, the British bruiser could foul up Patterson's time schedule that calls for the Johansson defence June 25 at Yankee Stadium in New York. There always is the risk of a cut or a hand injury. If London should win, Johansson would be out the window in favor of a rematch.

Johansson will be at ringside, watching with intense interest. This first world championship match in Indiana figures to do remarkably good business, considering the stuttering start when dates, sites and promoters were shifted daily.
London has gone out of his way to charm the local people, appearing at schools and handling himself well in press conferences. British reporters say this is a reversal of form for London, who is known back home as an angry young man. Perhaps it is the warm glow induced by a guarantee of \$60,000 plus expenses that may run as high as \$15,000, biggest purse ever for the 24-year-old boxer.
CHAMP'S SHARE
Cus D'Amato, the champion's manager, is getting 60 per cent of the net (no guarantee) and all of the television money, estimated between \$175,000 and \$200,000. From that total, London gets his \$60,000 plus expenses.
This is the 24-year-old Patterson's fourth defence. He stopped Hurricane Jackson in 10 and Pete Rademacher, the U.S. amateur champ, in six in 1957. Last year, he stopped Roy Harris in 12 at Los Angeles. His record is 34-1 with 25 knockouts, losing only to Joey Maxim in eight rounds in 1954. He has won 21 straight, knocking out 15 of his last 16 opponents but was floored by both Rademacher and Harris.
