The drilling, in 1909, was authorized by the responsible federal government department, and the actual drilling was done by an American outfit.

The 18-inch casing was hauled from St. Louis—the casing is still there after 54 years—and it was used to bore a hole for electric power. They even had a dynamo to provide electric lights for the around-the-clock drilling, and that certainly must have been the first use for electric lights in that area of the country.
