The two hundredth anniversary of the founding of the order of the Christian Brothers was celebrated in Baltimore on Thursday.

Mr. Childers, the new Minister for War has determined to carry out in the case of the army the same saving proclivities he manifested in regard to the sailors when he was First Lord of the Admiralty in Mr. Gladstone's last Cabinet.

The intelligence from Ireland is partly good in that it shows that no famine fever properly so called is making ravages there and in that it states that crop prospects there continue in the main promising. Mr. R. W. Wright, of West Cheshire, Connecticut, while engaged in 1847 in digging a well in Waukesha, Wisconsin, struck soil, which was evidently antiglacial, at a depth of about thirty-five feet. This soil was no sooner brought to the surface than it produced plants that were wholly unlike the local flora. Portions of the earth were carefully dried and subjected by Mr. Wright and Dr. Savage, the President of Carroll College, to microscopic examination, but no trace of any seed or anything like seed, could be discovered.
