Take any number from six to 10, and you can find some authority for just how many queens have ruled the distant isles since Anglo-Saxon times.

The first was Boadicea, whose husband ruled in Norfolk when Nero ruled in Rome.

The next early Queen was Athelstane's child, Alfred the Great and wife of the Earl of Mercia.

This was in the 10th century. In the 12th century, some-time Queen Matilda, daughter of Henri I, emerged.

Her marriage to Geoffrey Plantagenet brought that great family to the throne.

It wasn't until the 16th century that ladies again reached for the sceptre.

The nation was in turmoil and both France and Spain were reaching for the prize when Henry VIII died.

When Edward died in 1553, his death was kept secret for several days and Northumberland announced the 16-year-old Jane was Queen.
