## Canada Employment Centre on Campus

As Manager of the Canada Employment Centre on Campus here at UPEI, I would first like to welcome you to campus and hope that you have a challenging and fulfilling academic year. My name is David Dickie and my assistant is Madeline Lannan. We are located on the first floor of Main Building in the Student Services area adjacent to the Career Information Centre. Our office is open from 8:00 AM to 4:30 PM, Monday through Friday.

Basically, our job is to help you with your job search whether it be looking for part-time, summer, or full-time work. A series of information sessions are planned for October (each Tuesday in Room 01 of Main Building at 2:30 PM and 7:00 PM). Further information on the subject of each session will be advertised, but they will be aimed at various aspects of the job hunt and how to do it most effectively.

Graduating students should register with our office early. Registration is voluntary but we can only help you if we are able to contact you. Some of the services offered include:

- Job search technique discussions and workshops, incorporating the self-assessment component of the process.
- Information and application forms on provincial and federal government employment programs are also available.
- The on-campus recruitment program which organizes employers' visits to campus by scheduling employers' recruiting dates, posting job information for your perusal, sending all student applications to the employer for prescreening purposes, and arranging the interview schedules.
- Preparation for interviews and, where appropriate, arranging for a practice interview program (videotape "mock") to help you polish your interview skills.

- Assistance with resume writing, cover letters to employers and application forms (including U.C.P.A.)
- Employment counselling.
- Career Information Centre containing corporate information on companies, self-help booklets on resumes and interviews, and career information books on various aspects of the job hunt.
- Labour market, occupational and employment information.

The job hunting process is essentially an information hunt. The information is there - you just have to use it. Please feel free to make use of our services at your convenience.

The Association is in the planning stages of giving a presentation for the International Day of Peace on Monday, September 17. There will be posters announcing the event.

The Baha'i Faith had its origins in Iran in 1844 with the declaration of the Bab (Arabic for Gate) who told of the day when "Him Whom God shall manifest" would appear. After years of persecution, in which 20,000 followers were executed the Bab was finally executed in 1850. In 1863, Baha'u'llah,

(Arabic for Glory of God), proclaimed that He was the one who the Bab had spoken of. After years of exile, Baha'u'llah was imprisoned

in the prison city of Akka (Israel) where He died in 1892.

Among Baha'u'llah's teachings are, the oneness of God

and His prophets, independent investigation of the truth (hence no clergy), the obliteration of all forms of prejudice and superstition, the

harmony of science and religion, the equality of men and women, and the guidelines towards a universal government which Baha'is

are presently following. The world governing body of the Baha'i Faith (The Universal House of Justice) is seated atop Mt. Carmel in Israel.
