

U.S. Secretary Of Defence Discusses Military Plans

CHICAGO (AP)—Defense Secretary Robert McNamara outlined here a wide range of military moves the United States would use to cope with Communist war of different kinds in different places.

The cabinet member put his views into what the Pentagon regarded as a major speech before an American Bar Association dinner here.

The possibilities McNamara posed ranged from a "single massive attack" in nuclear retaliation to operations by a few men in the twilight zone of war against guerrilla snipers.

Significantly, he said in discussing nuclear aspects that the United States is not committed in advance "with respect to doctrine or targets."

Explosive Used In Car Blast Not Determined

TORONTO (CP) — Ontario crime laboratory technicians still have not determined the kind of explosive that blasted 36-year-old Walter Yetman's car outside his home Feb. 13.

Yetman, of St. Mary's Nfld., who was said to have received threats of death prior to the bombing, was killed as he prepared to drive to his job at a city garbage incinerator.

Police later charged Peter Ado Kriviel, said to be a friend of Yetman's wife, in connection with cheques taken from a construction company office and cashed under the name of the dead man's brother.

Kriviel was unable to raise the \$5,000 bail and remained in custody.

Crime technicians had been attempting to piece the 1953 model car together in the hope it would yield fingerprints or other clues.

Homicide detectives at first estimated anywhere from five to 12 sticks of dynamite had been placed under the car's hood and connected to explode when the engine was started.

Aloysius J. Leahy, Yetman's workmate, and boarder escaped death by seconds. He was about to leave the house and join Yetman in the car when the vehicle disintegrated.

Labor Talks Will Affect Steel Trend

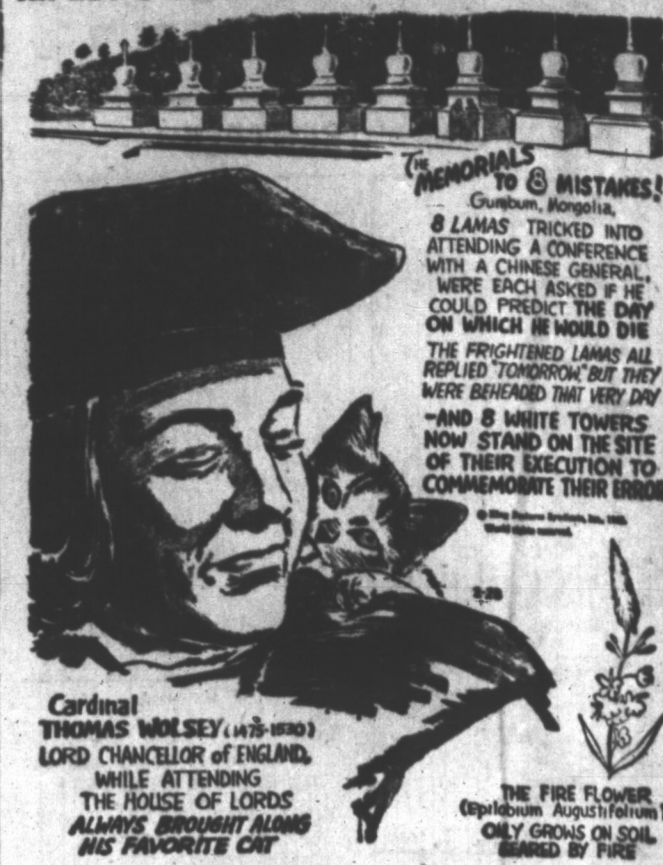
CLEVELAND (AP) — Developments in the steel labor talks going on in Pittsburgh will have more effect on the steel market than automobile sales, international developments, or anything else, Steel magazine said.

"Rising hopes for an early agreement will mean falling orders for steel," the metalworking weekly said. "Worsening prospects for a peaceful settlement will trigger an order unswing and renewed inventory building."

The magazine said buyers have covered their short-term requirements and have ordered more steel than they expect to use this quarter, with their inventories at the end of March expected to be at least 3,000,000 tons larger than they were on Jan. 1.

Steel said chances for a peaceful labor settlement are excellent, but it won't come as quickly and easily as some predict.

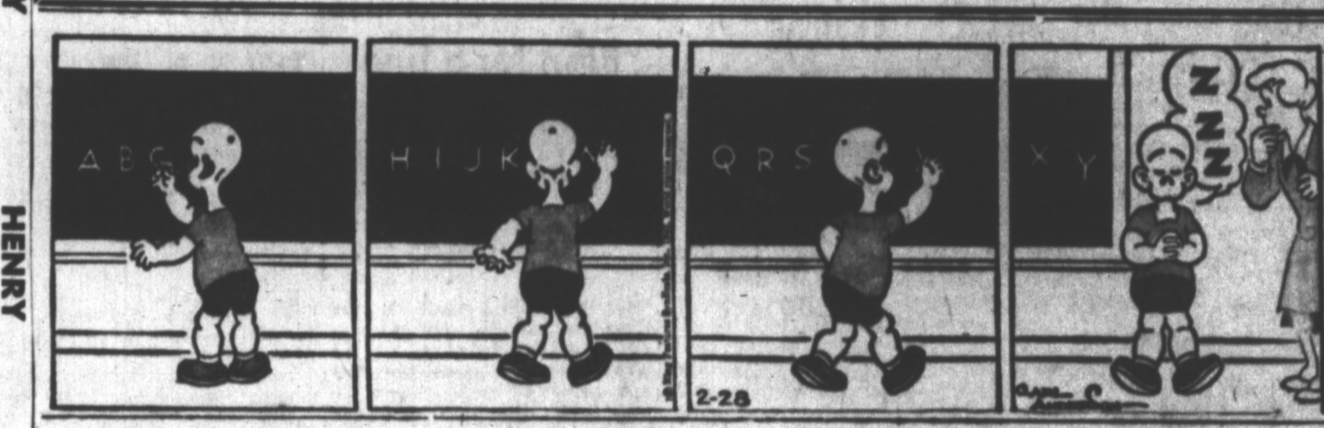
