

Propaganda Bunting Seen In French Viet Nam Views

By RICHARD K. O'MALLEY PARIS (AP) — France may have banded her propaganda. Her insistence that the United States cannot win a guerrilla war in Viet Nam, that she should negotiate for neutralization, has generally been interpreted to mean: Get out of Viet Nam.

This raised resentment in the United States as a defeatist position which could only hamper U.S. efforts and prolong the conflict.

But France has never said she wanted a Communist takeover of Viet Nam. France appears to consider it realistic that no decisions concerning Southeast Asia can be taken without Peking participation.

The French want to see guaranteed neutralization. "Guaranteed" is the important qualification. This could mean that the United States would commit itself to seeing that South Viet Nam maintained a neutral position while China was responsible for North Viet Nam.
