

Maroons Stop Beavers 6-2

CHATHAM Ont. (CP)—Chatham Maroons overpowered Saint John Beavers with first and second period outbursts Wednesday night to defeat the Maritimers 6-2 and take a 3-1 lead in their eastern Canada Allan Cup final series.

Forward Lloyd Ferguson led Maroons with three goals as they grabbed a stranglehold on the best-of-seven series. The fifth game is scheduled for Friday. Winner of the set meets Vernon Canadians for the cup and Canadian senior hockey crown.

Maroons fired four goals in the first period before Beavers scored and added another pair in the second. There was no scoring in the final 20 minutes.

Referees Doug Young and Gord Parons of Detroit, Mich., handed out 16 penalties, including two majors and a 10-minute misconduct. Beavers received 10 penalties, including one major.

Alex Viskelvis, who opened the scoring in the three preceding games, did it again Wednesday night. Dick Kotefian and Eddie Busch got the other Chatham goals. Nick Nicolle and Jerry Smith scored for the losers.

Viskelvis scored at the 2:36 of the first period after taking a pass from Busch. Kotefian made it 2-0 at 16:20. Ferguson fired two quick goals—at 18:01 and 18:23—before Smith gave Beavers their first goal at 18:32.

With defenceman Lloyd Hinchberger serving a Saint John penalty, Busch made it 5-1 at 8:04 of the middle period and Ferguson scored Chatham's sixth goal at 15:34 while Frank Kuzma of Beavers was in the penalty box. Nicolle closed the scoring less than three minutes from the end of the period.

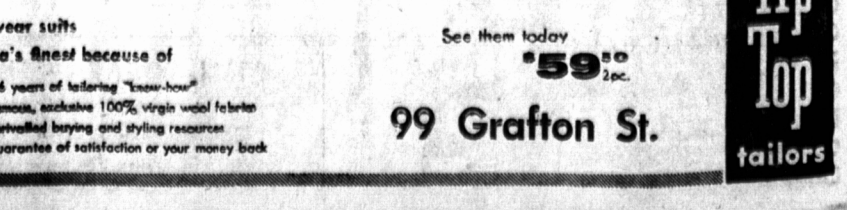
