

# Parish Hall To Become Museum

**TIGNISH** — The removal of the old Parish Hall at Tignish, where it served for 138 years first as a church, then as a grammar school and later as a parish hall, should bring back many memories as the building is moved to its new location further north on Church Street, where it will be used for a museum and cultural centre under the leadership of Mrs. L. E.
