THE WAR IN THE ORIENT.

Some Grave Questions Starting Europe in the Face

The New York Sun's London special says: The grave questions for Europe, and especially for England, arising out of the war in the East are already seriously disturbing diplomatic and commercial circles. The long-since expected war between important powers existed that the respective governments, including the British, will find it difficult in enforcing strict laws of neutrality. It is virtually necessary for China to provide herself with immense quantities of war material, and it is already known that she is willing to pay fabulous prices. It is a fact she is busily intriguing in England, Germany, Belgium and Italy for the purchase of ships and ammunition and to engage men. It is an almost open secret in certain circles in London that she is making time-honored excuses to assemble a fleet in a certain continental port from which it could soon be despatched by an indirect route to the sea of war. The name of a certain well-known ex-officio British navy whippersnapper as commander of the expedition. It is argued that the fine man-of-war Alaska, which the Thames river company is putting the finishing touches on, could still be secured without violating the neutrality laws. The vessel was built for a South American republic, which is too poor to complete the contract. It is also believed China is offering enormous bribes to certain South American states for the purchase of war ships not needed just now by the present owners. The Japanese legation here has received information leading them to believe that valuable cargoes are now leaving San Francisco and Vancouver for China on vessels which stop first at Yokohama. They telegraphed their Government yesterday to intercept them. It is apparent that the news from both China and Japan must be carefully weighed before its credibility is estimated. Even official announcements are open to suspicion, especially those from Chinese sources. The most important and ominous news yet received is that regarding the Emperor's rebuke of Li Hung Chang. Great doubt of the truth of this report is expressed in London, but its source makes it entitled to more credence than anything yet received from China. A correspondent of the Central News in Tientsin, who has sent three despatches on the subject, is not only one of the most influential foreigners in China, but also the best personal friend of the great Viceroy, whose disgrace he describes. It is the deprivation of the highest honor, the order of the Yellow Jacket, meant that the veteran statesman was deposed from power, it would look ill for China in the coming war and for all foreigners on her borders. But all persons who understand Chinese ways, say it implies merely a rebuke intended to urge the Prime Minister to greater efforts against the enemy. He suffered a similar indignity twenty years ago, but speedily regained his lost influence and still greater power. It is the Prime Minister, who is now only 23 years of age, has suddenly taken the reins of the Government in his own hands, overthrowing the influence of the old manager Empress, who has been the real head of affairs for many years.

TO CUT THE WAR SHORT.

The only hope of cutting short the war at the outset lies in England taking advantage of the Kow Shing affair to interpose decisively. This subject is engaged the active attention of the British cabinet, and public feeling on the matter is becoming very strong. It can no longer be doubted that the transport ship carried the British flag when she was attacked, but the Japanese are by no means without defence for their action. Prof. Westlake, an acknowledged authority on international law, and the expert in the subject in the Times yesterday says: "The Kow Shing affair to have been British owned and rightfully flying the British flag, but it is equally certain that she was acting as a transport in the Chinese service. If to this it is found possible to add that the service was a belligerent one nothing is more certain than that she was not entitled to protection from the British flag and ownership. It is equally certain that the Japanese were not precluded from taking that service as a belligerent one by the fact that she was not entitled to protection from the British flag and ownership. To begin war without a declaration is a bad habit, which, nevertheless, found its centuries past into the practices of nations. Neutral are entitled to notice before they can be made liable to the responsibilities which war imposes. But the Kow Shing was not acting as a neutral, breaking a blockade or carrying contraband goods—she was a transport in the Chinese service, and, therefore, belligerent if China was belligerent. Japan must show either that war had already been commenced by acts of hostility elsewhere, or that the Chinese fleet, of which the Kow Shing formed a part, was engaged in service the completion of which Japan could not be expected to permit. The former alternative might be satisfied either by acts of hostility committed between Corea and Japan in Corea, or by acts of hostility committed between Corea and Japan in the course of the line of action in which Corea was receiving the support of China. Justification might probably be sustained on the ground of latter alternative by showing that the reinforcements of the fleet in question were being poured into Corea for the purpose of dislodging the Japanese from a position which they claimed to be entitled to hold there."
