

Current Notes.

The \$20,000 bequeathed in 1856, to Hartford, Conn., by John M. Niles, to be held till it had doubled, now amounts to \$40,335, and the income will be used henceforth, in accordance with the terms of the bequest, to furnish poor families with fuel.

Landed proprietors in Hungary still hold absolute control over the liquor dealers on their estates. This is now to cease. The power is to pass into the hands of the Local Government authorities, and the land-owners will receive \$25,000,000 compensation.

Rev. Mr. Landsell, an English clergyman, who started several weeks ago from St. Petersburg on a missionary tour in Siberia, was arrested and brought back, the police having taken the Bible he distributed for Nihilist literature. After some considerable difficulty, however, the rev. gentleman freed himself.

A Hartford woman has received letters from two young Chinamen who were formerly students in that city. They say that the Chinese law has weakened China's confidence in this country so greatly that no more boys will be sent here for education. Those who have already received a training in our schools are being put into government positions, displacing foreigners, who have been receiving very high salaries. Gen. Gordon gets what is equivalent to \$100,000 a year as instructor and practical head of the army.

Twenty-six Russian cavalry officers are declared to have paid a thousand rubles each for a dinner a short time ago at Warsaw. They had determined to have a dinner worthy of those Roman Emperors who preferred luxuries out of season, regardless of their cost, and they are said to have succeeded fairly well in their attempt. For some eight hours they sat at the table consuming plate after plate. One of their courses was a ragout of African turtle, and another stewed nightingales. Each man had a wreath of roses round his head during the entertainment.

Even Japan has announced its desire to introduce a protective tariff. At present four-fifths of the revenue of the Government is raised by a land tax, the Customs dues bringing in but one-fifth of the gross amount. The people do not distill liquor nor grow and manufacture tobacco to any extent, hence no revenue can be derived from these sources. The tax on hand weights heavily on agricultural enterprise, as it amounts to 20 per cent. of the annual agricultural yield. The first step sought to be taken is to secure the abrogation or modification of its trade treaties with foreign powers. Application has been made to the English Government, but they refuse to permit any change to be made in its treaty, which fixes 10 per cent. ad valorem as the maximum duties.

The German Government has adopted a magazine rifle, the invention of Messrs. Mauser. The magazine consists of a tube contained in the stock, and has a spiral spring which keeps the cartridges up to the breech-action. When the bolt is withdrawn a cartridge—which has been forced out of the magazine by the spiral spring—is raised up to the level of the cartridge chamber, into which it is driven by the bolt as it returns. The whole action of loading is comprised in the backward and forward motion of the bolt. In order to avoid waste of ammunition, a level is attached to one side of the action, by which the magazine can be instantly closed, the gun being then loaded and fired as an ordinary breech-loader. The re-loading of the magazine is stated only to occupy a few seconds.

A group of French gourmets the other day—apostles of the cookery of the future—came to the conclusion that the earth-worm, sadly unappreciated until Mr. Darwin gave it its proper rank in the scheme of creation, had always been underrated as a viand. Why wait till he has been assimilated into fish or fowl? Why not eat him at once, first-hand? They tried it, fifty of them. First they put the worms in vinegar; then rolled them in butter and fried them; and finally ate them. After the first plateful, says the voracious chronicler, the fifty guests rose like one man and asked for more. Could anything be more convincing? And yet a great authority in Paris has said, sadly, that no advance has been made in the sublime science of cookery since the days—and dishes—of Brillat-Savarin.
