

LIVERPOOL BACK AGAIN

It's nearly four years since The Beatles - the most successful group in pop music history - last played together. A bitter, and as yet unresolved, fight split the four Merseyside pals who had revolutionized recording and started a trend in which British rock groups can fill concert halls the world over.

John and Yoko settled in New York to do their own thing; George took up Indian studies and charity concerts; Ringo developed his movie career, while Paul went to his new wife, Linda, before starting their own group, Wings.

While all this was happening, the world, it seemed had taken off on a mad flight of nostalgia. Fashions and movies went back to the 40s and 50s. But for music, it was largely rock n' roll from the 50s. Predictably, tastes would advance to the 60s and there would again be a resurgence in demand for Beatles' music.

Being slightly ahead of trends is one of the keys to success in entertainment or fashion. Vic Wilson, a bearded Toronto musician who has turned to the business side of the music industry by



promoting groups and concerts with his S.R.O. companies, sensed this trend before it arrived.

He spent the first three months of 1973 auditioning groups and musicians to try to put together a group that

could recreate the music of the Beatles.

On March 12, 1973, he put his new group out for their first concert - at a High School in Kirkland Lake. The four members of the group, appropriately called Liverpool, had met for the first time eight days earlier. That first concert was marked by such statements as: "Hey, what key are you playing in?"

In the year that followed the four components of Liverpool - Rick Pearson and Dave Moyles from Toronto and Laurie Currie and Brian Meissner from Saskatchewan - have spent so much time working and on the road that they have hardly been apart.

Following their current Western tour, the quartet are to play four days in April at the famous Whisky a Go Go in Los Angeles - the spot that launched rock superstar Elton John.

At least two of the Beatles - John Lennon and George Harrison - are expected to drop in to see the Liverpool perform in Los Angeles.
