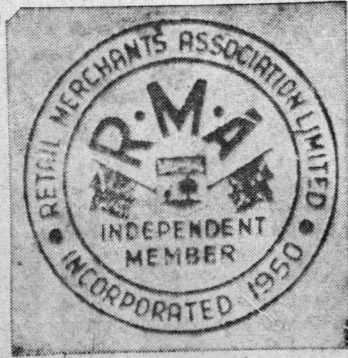
Mr. Wilfred Gaudet, DeBlois, left recently for Danvas, Mass. where he plans to make his home in the future.
