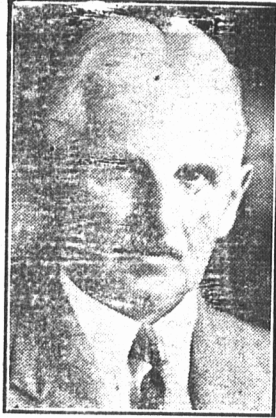
NOEL H. DeBellefleur

Mr. Cotton, after his return from France in 1919, where he served with the Second Canadian Machine Gun Battalion, disposed of his newspaper, job printing and retail stationery interests in which he had been busily engaged from early youth and retired from active business to look after his real estate holdings in the Brighton district of Charlottetown and his shore property at Rocky Point at the entrance to Charlottetown harbor. Was born in Charlottetown, son of the late William L. Cotton, widely known Canadian journalist who established the first daily newspaper to be published in Prince Edward Island. Was for some years Chairman of the Provincial Board of Commissioners of Public Utilities, was active in Board of Trade affairs for many years and is now a member of the Trustees of the Prince Edward Island Hospital and of St. Peter's Cathedral.
