Outrage in Turkey.

The United States Secretary of State received from the United States chargé d'affaires at Constantinople, informing him that the house of Dr. Bartlett, an American missionary at Bourdour, province of Konia, Asia Minor, had been burned, and that the lives of the missionaries were in danger. He believed that if prompt action were not taken the lives of the missionaries would be in serious danger in other places.

The building of Dr. Bartlett's residence was originally stopped by the local authorities. On application being made for permission to complete the same, it was refused, unless Dr. Bartlett would furnish a bond or guarantee to neither hold religious worship nor instruct children on the premises. The withholding of the permit was claimed to be under orders from Constantinople. The legation applied to the Sublime Porte for such permission, claiming that the treaty rights of Americans extended not only to the purchase of land, but also to the enjoyment of the same. The permit was finally granted by the Sultan, and it appears that immediately after the house was burned.

Secretary Foster promptly cabled the charge d'affaires to make urgent demand for effective protection, indemnity, punishment of the guilty parties and reprimand of the authorities, if found remiss. The United States cruisers Newark and Bennington, now on their way to Genoa, will be ordered to the vicinity of the outrage to support the demand. Secretary Foster says the complaints of the infringements of the treaty rights of American missionaries in Turkey had been accumulating since 1883. One notable instance was the outrage upon Rev. Mr. Knapp and Dr. Reynolds by Mousa Bey, in this same province of Asia Minor. It had taken seven years to secure the punishment of the offender, and the United States was now determined to see if American citizens had any treaty rights which the Turkish authorities were bound to respect.

A Wise Selfishness.

Another does spend herself too freely for her children when she gives up her own rights to them, effaces herself so that they do not recognize her superior claims, makes it difficult for them to "honor" her, as the Fifth Commandment demands that they shall do, writes Elizabeth Robinson Sewell in her helpful department in the September Ladies' Home Journal.

It is a wise selfishness that makes the mother insist upon keeping her proper place in the family as the crown and centre of home, tenderly loving her children, serving them in all legitimate ways, but seeing that they take their fair share of the burdens of life, instead of weakly bearing them herself.

News Notes.

The village of St. Stephen, Switzerland, has been almost completely destroyed by fire.

The Irish census for 1891 has just been published. It shows a population of 4,704,750, a decrease since 1881 of 479,036.

Sections of England, Scotland and Wales had an earthquake shock on Thursday last which broke crockery and glassware.

A despatch to the London Times from St. Petersburg says: Serious riots have occurred in the small manufacturing towns of Hugsosofka, on the Sea of Azov, where thousands of hands are employed in extensive iron works, collieries and rolling mills of the new Russian company founded by the late John Hughes. Many buildings have been destroyed, and it is reported that several Cossacks have been killed. The governor of Taganarof has started for the scene, and troops and reinforcements have also left Ekaterinodar. It is thought that the riots are due to the cholera epidemic.
