VETERAN PEER DIES

ELLESMERE, Shropshire, England, Sept. 24 (AP) — Lord Maenan, believed to be the oldest man ever made a peer, died at his home here Saturday aged 97. Lord Maenan, born William Francis Kyffin Taylor, became a baron at 94 on retirement after 45 years as presiding judge of the Liverpool Court of Passage. None of his decisions ever was reversed on appeal to higher courts. There is no heir.

planted from the field to their permanent place in the rock-garden, also new plants of my favorite blue Viola.

Fuschia plants as large as shrubs are very lovely now blooming with the deep purple Jackmanni Clematis and they will continue until heavy frost when they will be put into large tubs and carried to the basement for the winter season. Hosta or Plantain Lily has been divided and planted in shady spots where the foliage seems to look so much better.

Parsley was not introduced into England Great Britain until 1543. It is said that the Greeks venerated the plant and at the Isthmian games, crowned their champions with wreaths made of it. Today herbalists tell us that apart from its well-known culinary uses, Parsley removes all traces of Onions or Garlic from the breath if it is eaten after either of these.

The old saying "We are at the Parsley and Rue" which means the very beginning of a project, seems to have originated from the fact that ancient Greek gardens were bordered with these two well-known herbs. It is a good plan to plant some Parsley in flower pots for Winter use in the home, and it will be very good for decorating
