Dalai Lama

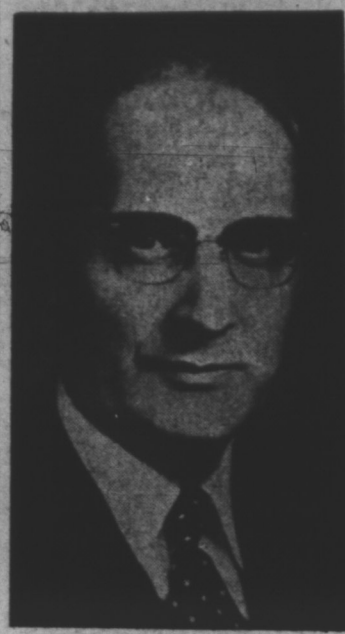
KALIMPONG, India (Reuters) Communist China pressed forward Tuesday with a huge manhunt in an attempt to intercept the Dalai Lama before he crosses to safety in India.

More than 50,000 Chinese troops combed Himalayan villages and monasteries. Dozens of planes flew low over the towering peaks. Paratroopers were dropped into mountain passes leading to India.

# Rev. K.S. Willis To Speak At City Youth Service

Rev. Kenneth S. Willis of Toronto will be guest speaker at the first Charlottetown Ecumenical Youth Service to be held at Zion Presbyterian Church Sunday, April 5, commencing at 3.00 p.m.

A minister of the Churches of Christ (Disciples), Mr. Willis is secretary, department of Christian education of the Canadian Council of Churches through which Anglican, Baptist, Disciples, Evangelical, Presbyterian and United Churches, the Salvation Army, YMCA, YWCA, and SCM, co-operate in Christian education work.

Mr. Willis undertook his present task in April 1951 following a successful six-year pastorate in Central Christian Church, Vancouver, B.C., where he was also president of the Vancouver Ministerial Association, and vice-president of the Vancouver Council of Churches.

## ARTS GRADUATE

An Arts graduate of McMaster University, Mr. Willis also trained at the Ontario College of Education, studied theology at the College of the Churches of Christ and Emanuel, Toronto, and at Union College, Vancouver.

A member of the North American administrative committee of the World Council of Christian Education and Sunday School Association, Mr. Willis in 1954 represented Canada at a meeting of its assembly in Frankfurt, Germany, and shared in the planning for the World Sunday School convention held in Tokyo in 1958.

Under his leadership the department of Christian education has grown from a group of heterogeneous interdenominational committees to a co-ordinated and effective unit of the Canadian Council of Churches.

TUXIS' SECRETARY  
As national boys' work secretary, Mr. Willis is the executive secretary of the Tuxis movement. He was secretary of the committee which developed Sigma-C, the new Canadian program for boys 12 to 14. He is also a member of the National Council of the Boy Scouts association of Canada.

Taking part in the service will be young people representing the various member communions in the Canadian Council of Churches—Anglican, Baptist, Christian Church, Presbyterian, Salvation Army, the United Church, plus the Y.M.C.A.

The purpose of this Ecumenical Youth Service is threefold: (1) To bring together Christian youth of all Protestant churches in a service of worship and in an act of common worship; (2) To promote Christian understanding and goodwill among the youth of the churches in the community; and (3) To call Christian youth to consecration of themselves to Jesus Christ and the work of His church.

The service is open to the public, and it is expected that adult members of all Protestant communions will give the young

## Supreme Court Denies Appeal

The appeal of Hugh Campbell heard in the Supreme Court before Mr. Justice George J. Tweedy yesterday morning was dismissed and the conviction upheld.

Campbell was appealing a sentence handed down by Magistrate Gilbert A. Gaudet, Q.C. several months ago. At that time the appellant was convicted of possessing a quantity of wash suitable for the manufacture of illicit spirits.

The sentence imposed was a six-month jail term plus a \$500 fine or in default of the fine an additional six months sentence.

This was the accused's second conviction under the Excise Act. Allison Gillis was counsel for the defence. The Crown was represented by J. P. Nicholson.

## Evidence Heard In Arson Case In City Court

Evidence was completed yesterday morning in City Police Court in the case of a Charlottetown man charged with attempted arson. Following a brief plea by defence counsel R.R. Bell, Q.C. the case was adjourned until Thursday, April 9 by Magistrate K.M. Martin.

A city police constable testified that he found a partially burnt liquor permit made out in the name of the accused at the scene of the fire at the rear of Kelly and McInnis clothing store on Great George street. Shown portions of burnt shingles, the witness identified them as those he had taken from the burned area on the wall of the building.

The constable said that on returning to the scene a second time he found some matches and a partially burnt cigar.

A city press photographer identified several photos he had taken at the area at the request of Deputy Chief Sterns Webster. Eight other cases were on the docket that faced Magistrate Martin. A Charlottetown man charged with being drunk and disorderly was remanded until April 9.

All remaining cases were persons charged with being drunk and incapable. Two city residents and one from Tryon were each fined \$20 and costs or 10 days. Two others from the city drew 30 day jail terms. Two other city residents were remanded, one until Saturday and the other until April 9.

## Influenza Spreading

Influenza has hit Prince Edward Island in near epidemic proportions with the Summerside area reportedly one of the hardest hit.

Prince County Hospital in Summerside has been closed to visitors until further notice.

While statistics are difficult to compile it is thought to be infecting an exceedingly large number of people. Some of the people afflicted have been hospitalized while others suffer out the attack at home.

Charlottetown's schools were hit fairly hard last week, but school authorities felt that the Easter holiday period now in progress would prove a buffer to its spread. The schools are scheduled to open again Tuesday.

In some cases it is difficult to distinguish the flu from a bad cold. Symptoms are similar.
