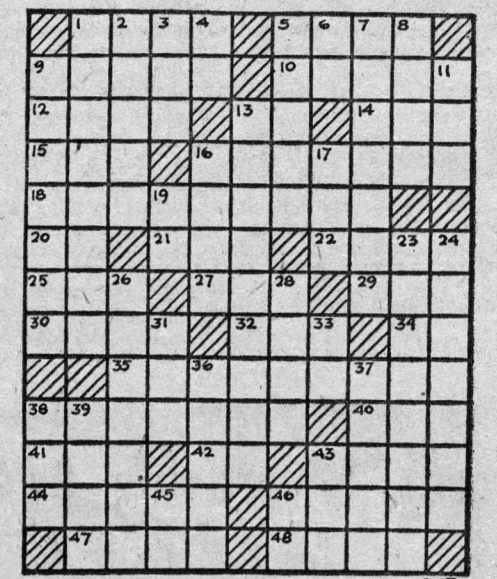
The bidding:

Opening lead—jack of hearts. Bill Hanna, of Los Angeles, who knows his way around a bridge table, found himself in four spades. It's not up to us to justify the aggressive bidding sequence—we're just reporting what happened. Besides, the hand came up in a pair tournament, and coin of the realm was not involved.

At trick one, with the jack of hearts opening lead, Hanna could already feel the hot breath of defeat on his neck. After looking the situation over briefly, he played the five (!) of hearts from dummy. East played low, and West was still on lead.

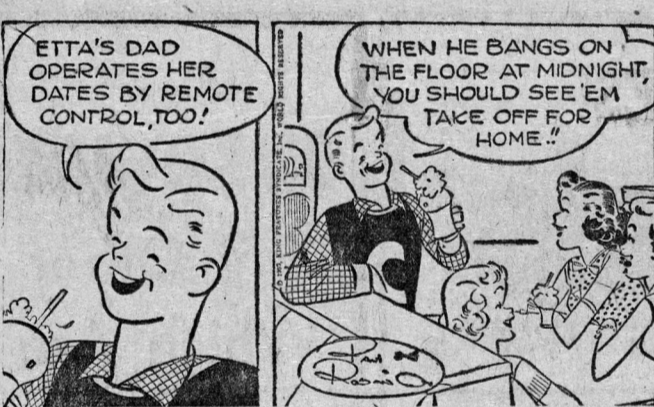

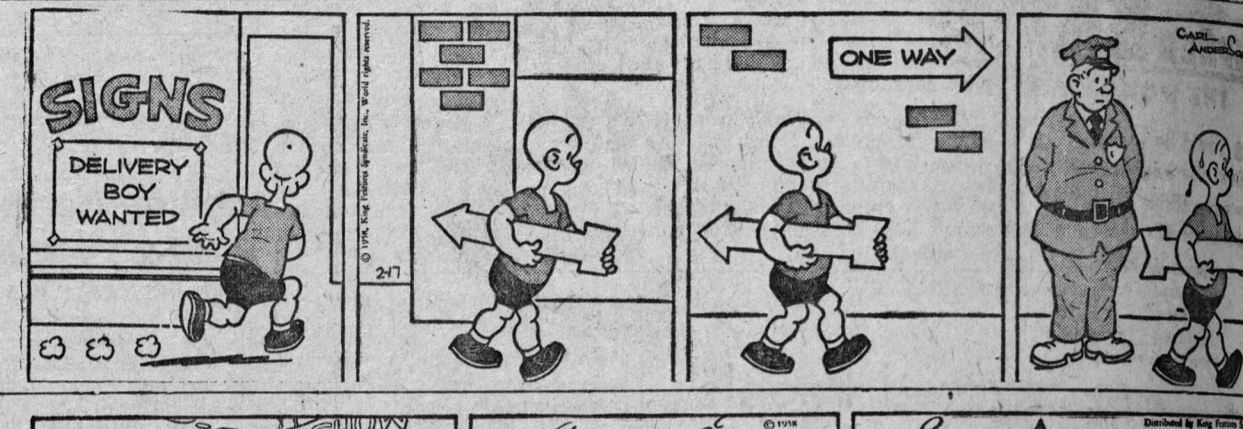

BANDIT EXECUTED

TEHRAN, Iran (Reuters)—An army firing squad executed an Iranian bandit at dawn Wednesday for the kidnap-murder of an American woman last March. Ahmad Shah has been sentenced to death for slaying Mrs. Anita Carroll of Issaquah, Wash., in the wilds of southeastern Iran. Annihilation Warning Is Sounded By Liberal Leader

SUDBURY, Ont. (CP)—Liberal Leader Lester B. Pearson has pledged his "supreme devotion" to help unshackle enslaved people and work to head off a possible third "and last" world war if he becomes prime minister March 31.

"Irresponsible or reckless action in the international field can today mean nothing less than the annihilation of the human race," he told a political rally in this Northern Ontario mining community Thursday night.

The stakes were high, the 1957 Nobel Peace Prize winner said. He did not want to be an alarmist but Canadians had to face the possibility that the world might be thrust into the horrors of an atomic war.

Canada was in an effective position to promote world peace through international negotiations, added the former external affairs minister who helped resolve the 1956 Suez crisis. He would devote all his might to this "supreme task."

TIME RUNNING OUT

"Time is running out," he told the capacity crowd of some 600 who turned out in sub-zero weather to hear the new Liberal chieftain in Sudbury high school auditorium.

"If something is not done in the right direction, then we might slide into the wrong direction." The fledgling leader, elected to that office just a month ago, pushed the issue of peace and international diplomacy to the forefront as he opened his campaign to reverse the Liberals' defeat of last June.

But he also emphasized the issues of trade and unemployment, accusing the Progressive Conservatives of bungling trade relations with the United States and aggravating a serious unemployment situation in Canada.

WOULD CUT TAXES

In his opening speech at nearby Espanola where he was unanimously nominated Algoma East Liberal standard-bearer for the fifth time since 1948, and here at Sudbury, he touched briefly on his \$400,000,000 tax-cut plan, pointing out differences between it and the \$500,000,000 tax-cut idea put forward by the former Conservative leader, George Drew, in the 1953
