Queens Liberals Expected To Nominate Gillis And Lewis

Lawyer Allison Gillis of Charlottetown and farmer Ian Lewis of York will definitely offer to nominate as federal candidates for the Liberal party at the Queens County Liberal nominating convention Friday.

Harry MacLaughlin president of the Queens County Liberal Association, said last night, both have indicated to him they will seek the nomination.

It is not expected that any other candidates will oppose Mr. Gillis and Mr. Lewis although other nominations may come from the floor.

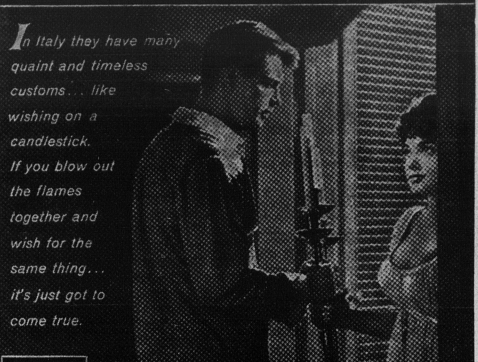
