EDUCATED MONKEYS FOIL PLANS FOR SPACE TEST

LOS ALAMOS, N.M. (AP)—Six female monkeys have used their "college education" and well-added derrieres to foil their trainers and cause a space flight experiment to be cancelled.

The monkeys had been scheduled for tests in which their performance in a simulated space capsule while under exposure to radiation was studied. Scientists at the U.S. Atomic Energy Commission's Los Alamos laboratory wanted to learn what effects solar radiation would have on astronauts during space flights.

But the monkey wrench went into the works when the "astronomons" discovered how to avoid, and thus ignore, electrical shocks.

The monkeys had been trained for other experiments and replaced by 12 rhesus monkeys, which aren't so well padded.

But, being macaca species monkeys, they are gifted with thick callous where they sit. After a little experimentation, the monkeys began to wedge their hands and feet against the plastic walls of the capsules, leaving only the callous exposed to the floor and avoiding effects of the current.

"There was no alternative but to cancel," a Los Alamos radiologist said explaining that the shocks were necessary for keeping the animals' behavior predictable.

The monkeys will be re-trained for other experiments and replaced by 12 rhesus monkeys, which aren't so well padded.

Opening lead — ace of diamonds.

Here is an interesting hand reported by Dr. James Parzak in the British Bridge Magazine. As usual, the doctor casts his favorite character, Fred, in the role of hero.

It seems that Fred, on this occasion, was playing in a team of four and held the South hand. He was the dealer and opened with one spade. Now it is true that most players would have opened the bidding with two spades with Fred's hand, but Fred was not often inclined to do what most players would do.

West overcalled with two diamonds and East jumped to five diamonds. This development did not faze Fred, who now bid five hearts in what can best be described as a forcing voice.

North then came to life and raised the ante to six hearts, which West doubled, and then, after two passes, West led the ace of diamonds.

Fred ruffed, of course, and played the king of hearts, East showing out. This complication, with West having all four missing trumps, might have upset a different declarer, but Fred, as usual, took the 4-0 break in a stride.

When he then cashed the ace of clubs and West dropped the queen on it, Fred's face lit up like a Christmas tree. Situations like this were always a source of great joy to him and he proceeded to make the contract in his usual bang-bang style.

He led the six of hearts and, after ruffing the jack of diamonds with the queen of hearts, led the seven and finessed the ten. When Fred now cashed the ace of hearts, he discarded the king of clubs on it, as he was then able to cash all of dummy's clubs, which brought him to twelve tricks.

During the post-mortem, when Fred was asked why he had not tried to develop the spades instead of the clubs, he replied, "What spades?"
