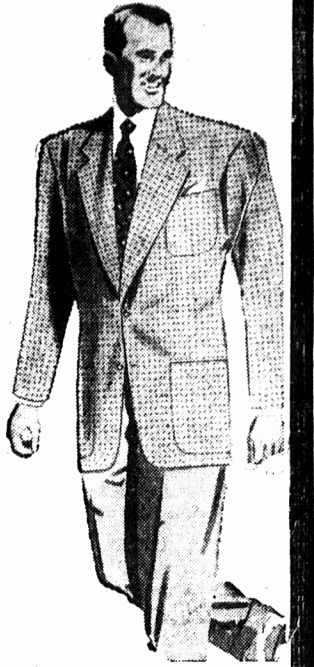

## Abbie Juniors Score 4-1 Victory Over C. B. Juniors

Behind the 2-hit pitching of southpaw Benny Carson, the Abbie Juniors played all but errorless ball at the Queen Elizabeth Park baseball diamond yesterday morning, and defeated the Curran & Briggs Juniors by the score of 4-1. Carson was never better before Summerside fans, not giving up a single hit after the second inning of a game that went only seven frames in accordance with an agreement made before the game started. Ed Buckley for C. & B. also pitched good ball, but not up to Carson's performance. Buckley allowed nine hits. The visitors got their first two runs, both earned, in the first inning. With one out, Ian Kennedy, Kip Ready and Don MacLeod hit successive singles to fill the bases. Carson popped to the pitcher for the second out, but "Red" MacFadyen drove a double inside the third base line to score I. Kennedy and Ready. Their second brace of tallies were

unearned, and came in the sixth inning as a result of two consecutive hits, and a two-run error in left field. The fireworks didn't start until two were out this time. Don MacLeod hit to centre, and Benny Carson drove another grounder through the same hole. The runners advanced on a wild pitch, and MacFadyen's looper to left was dropped allowing MacLeod and Carson to cross the plate. C. & B. spoiled Carson's shutout in the final inning. Cannon walked and Dunn, scooping

up Lefurgey's roller to third, threw wild to second in an attempt to force Cannon and the runners went to second and third. Donnie Cameron's fly to centre field brought Cannon in with the Curran's lone tally. Curran & Briggs also played above par in the field only two errors being charged to them. Paul Schurman's bare-hand stab of Dunn's foul in the fifth was a particularly brilliant effort, and right afterwards Buckley, Grady and Cannon came up with a beautiful double killing. Donnie MacLeod came up with one fine catch back of short field, and was also smooth on a couple of short to first outs.

competitor was Flight Cadet Dave Dunbar of the R.C.A.F. Station, Summerside, who covered the distance in one hour, twenty-eight minutes and fifty seconds; thirteen-year old Kenny Ford of Charlottetown finished third. The well conditioned Fardy lost close to a minute as a result of the car accident. He was knocked to the street and suffered a painful hip bruise but was able to remount the bike immediately. The accident occurred less than a quarter of a mile from the finish line. Fardy and Dunbar waged a close battle as far as Hunter River. The two cyclists were together at

Springfield Church and Frederickton but Fardy led a slight lead at Brookfield. He had lengthened the lead at Milton and held his own the rest of the way. Dunbar, who comes from Hamilton, Ontario, is a member of the R.C.A.F. reserve. He is an Arts student at the University of Western Ontario and plans to study medicine. Young Kenny Ford, a student at West Kent School, was participating in his first bike race. The game youngster did not intend to enter the race but accepted the challenge at the last minute and came up with an outstanding showing. Kenny is a son of Mr. and Mrs. Charles Ford.

The fourth starter Alex Gauthier of Rustico developed bike trouble and dropped out of the race before he reached Hunter River. Fardy, who is the son of Mr. and Mrs. Ernest Fardy of Charlottetown, is employed as a salesman at Kelly & McInnis clothing store. He competed in the 30 mile race last year and finished third. The cyclists were started at Kensington by Jifn Pendergast. The judges at the finish line were Wendell Beaton and Art Byrnes. The timer was Bill Bevin. The Department of Physical Fitness, which sponsored the race, awarded prizes to the winners at the track and field meet last night.
