TILT CAUSE SOUGHT

PISA, Italy (AP) — A seven man engineer group—five Italians, a Briton and a German—has been asked by the government to delve further into the theory that shifting sandy soil at its base causes the famed leaning tower here to lean ever closer to toppling. When the cause is fixed definitely, bids will be taken for a project to arrest the tilt. One expert predicts that at the present rate, he tower might fall in the year 2000.
