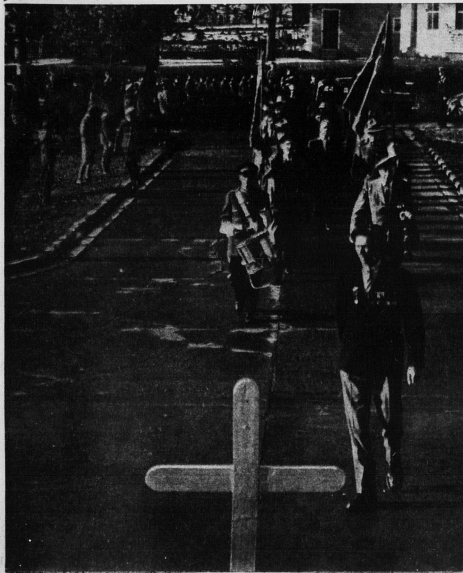

Taylor maintains outcome doubtful

By JOHN T. WHEELER SAIGON (AP)—U.S. Ambassador Maxwell D. Taylor believes that U.S. air strikes against Communist bases and supply lines in North Viet Nam will be the one that has the ultimate will to win. But the military aspect is only one piece of "very much in doubt."

The ambassador's appraisal, made in an interview with Life magazine, set off speculation that he might recommend an escalation of the war when he meets this week with President Johnson in Washington. Taylor flies home Wednesday.

Just as pure military action inside the country, will not win in itself," Taylor cautioned in the interview. "Let us say generally that the issue is very much in doubt. The winner will be the one that has the ultimate will to win. But the military aspect is only one piece of "very much in doubt."

REDS LOSE 12,000

U.S. policy makers, dissatisfied with the way the war has been going, have been studying the possibility of extending it to the north to check support of the Viet Cong. However, some observers fear China then might take a direct hand.

Taylor said the Communists

have grown to strength despite heavy losses. Gen. William C. Westmoreland, commander of U.S. forces in Viet Nam, said in the interview that body counts show 12,000 Viet Cong have been killed so far this year compared with 6,000 government Communist losses probably totalled 18,000.

"It is absolutely inconceivable to me that the Viet Cong could ever militarily defeat the armed forces of South Viet Nam," Westmoreland said.

Salmon was hit Sunday by its most serious anti-government riot since Premier Tran Van Huong took power 2½ weeks ago. Huong ordered police and paratroopers to use tear gas to disperse a march of 1,000 Buddhists on the government palace. An earlier Buddhist demonstration calling for Huong's resignation led to a score of persons being injured and 40 arrested.

Huong had warned that the 5,000, including Cubans and government would use force if necessary to put down demonstrations. Opponents charge Huong's cabinet is composed of technicians rather than politicians.

Exiles fear spy growth

MIAMI, Fla. (AP)—The Cuban exile colony fears that the number of Castro spies in the United States is growing. U.S. authorities say the situation is under control.

The head of an anti-Castro organization with an intelligence department of its own estimates more than one per cent of the Cuban refugees in the United States are Communist agents. About 200,000 Cubans have entered the U.S. since Cuban President Fidel Castro's 1959 takeover.

Another exile leader estimated the number of Castro agents at 5,000, including Cubans and Americans. An official of the state department's Cuban affairs office here described such claims as without substantiation.

REFUSES PROFFER BURNHAM GREEN, England (CP)—The owner of a 1931 Austin Seven that won an Austin concours d'elegance turned down a £1,100 offer for the car which cost him £100 two years ago. 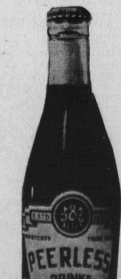
