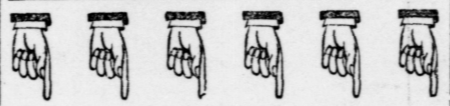
Est décédée à Tignish le 7 janvier, veuve Charrathers à l'âge de 87 ans.
