

Buster Keaton Finds Retirement Difficult

HOLLYWOOD (AP)—"I could retire mighty easy," says comedian Buster Keaton. But his public—or maybe it's Keaton—won't let him.
 Buster bought a retirement home in the San Fernando valley with the proceeds from his film biography, but he sees less of it than he'd like. The reason: The revival of the Keaton art continues to flourish.
 His silent features, with nothing added but a musical score, have been drawing crowds in Europe. Buster owns 10 of the old comedies plus numerous shorts and plans in this country abroad and in this country.
 He's busy with new films.

Working on comedy routines for the Ice Follies. "I tried to convince the boys to be comedians first and skaters second, but I failed," Buster sighed. And he has made a narrative sideline of television commercials. While in New York he appeared in a Keystone Cop sequence for Ford trucks and he has huckstered for headache remedies and other products.
 "Those commercials are lim-pid," he commented. "I got paid twice for the Ford job for each time it was shown. Some of the others pay each time they appear, and that adds up nicely."
STAR FOR CNR
 His next assignment sounds like a dream. He will star in a 15-minute short for Canadian National Railways to extol the joys of railway travel through Canada. The filming will take four weeks, during which he will tour the scenic wonders in his own limousine.
 "And I insisted on putting it on my contract that I would be assured 'if I don't duck twice a week,'" said Buster, almost smiling at the thought.
 At 67 Buster shows evidence

of good teeth, but he has lost little of his agility. His sick name came from his being tossed about the stage in his family's vaudeville act.

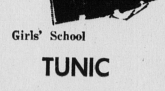
