Hoover Says U.S. Reds Rising Well-Organized

WASHINGTON (AP)—FBI director J. Edgar Hoover says the U.S. Communist party has surfaced as a "united, hard-hitting, well-organized conspiracy" to promote a class revolution in the United States.

In a report to the U.S. Senate internal security subcommittee on the party's June convention in New York, Hoover predicts the Communists will field "non-partisan" and "independent" candidates in the November U.S. congressional elections.

He forecasts an extensive campaign to infiltrate labor unions, college campuses, anti-Viet-Nam war demonstrations and civil-rights organizations. He says the "new left" also will be a target.

"The party has been watching with unhibited glee the rise of so-called 'new left' organizations and groups, which have culminated in 'peace' marches, protest demonstrations against American policy in Viet Nam and turmoil on college and university campuses," Hoover says in the report, released Sunday night.

The FBI director sees this as part of a youth drive the party has been able to put on since it has gained new freedom of action under recent U.S. Supreme Court decisions invalidating portions of the 1950 Internal Security Act.

In the field of labor organizations, Hoover says he is convinced major efforts will be made in Chicago, Detroit,

Cleveland, St. Louis and Pittsburgh.

"We can anticipate that the party, using the slogan 'labor is a key force,' will make every effort to increase its recruitment in industrial workers," he writes.

Hoover finds the Communists have been "acutely embarrassed" by their failure to recruit Negroes.

LAUDS NEGROES
"To their everlasting credit," he says, "the vast majority of Negroes have recognized the falsity of communism and have turned it down. They know that communism does not mean a better life for them—economically, politically or socially."

Nevertheless, he feels the Communists will continue to try to infiltrate civil rights organizations and to turn that area "into a hatchery for communism."

Says Canada Aiding Guyana

GEORGETOWN, Guyana (AP)—Finance Minister Peter Daguilar disclosed Saturday Guyana is to receive \$47,200,000 in aid for its seven-year \$300,000,000 development program.

Daguilar, recently back from Canada, the United States and Britain, explained the money will come from the following sources:

Canada: An interest-free loan for 50 years of \$1,700,000.

United States: \$5,000,000 which is the extension of grants or soft loans and \$5,500,000 for housing and financing.

Britain: A loan of \$2,000,000 for development expenditure; \$10,000,000 for the expansion of a telecommunication project; \$10,000,000 for electricity expansion and \$10,000,000 for new financing.

Blackballing Of Philip Blamed On Prejudice

LONDON (AP)—The president of one of Britain's leading scientific societies Sunday blamed professional prejudice for the blackballing of Prince Philip from honorary membership.

Sir Gordon Sutherland, president of the Institute of Physics and the Physical Society and master of Emmanuel College Cambridge, told reporters:

"Less than eight per cent eligible took the trouble to vote, thinking it was a foregone conclusion. Those who voted against did so for doctrinaire reasons—every honorary fellow has been an eminent scientist or Nobel Prize winner. In other words—professional prejudice."

"We had one or two letters to this effect. It is very unfortunate."

The prince's nomination to an honorary fellowship of the society was rejected in a secret ballot by letter after the prince last April accepted the invitation to become an honorary member.

remained silent and referred inquiries to the society and its members.

The society has 6,000 fellows. In the ballot papers circulated to them they were to write "yes" or "no" whether they wanted the prince as an honorary member. Confirmation of the choice had to be expressed by at least a 3-to-1 majority.

Asked what will happen now, Sir Gordon said: "I simply do not know. It is for the council of the society to decide."
