CANADIAN MARITIME COMMISSION

Invitation for Tenders for Steam or Motor Vessel Cargo Service

1. Tenders are invited for a weekly round trip cargo service between Charlottetown, P.E.I. and St. John's, Nfld., to commence on the opening of navigation on or about April 25, 1965, to the close of navigation on or about December 21, 1965, and will be received until 12 o'clock noon February 28, 1965. Tenders should be delivered by hand or mailed, addressed to the Director of Shipping Services, Canadian Maritime Commission, Room 500, Empire Building, 124 O'Connor Street, Ottawa, Ontario, and marked "Tenders for service-Prince Edward Island and Newfoundland."

2. Details of service to be performed can be obtained from the undersigned.

3. The vessel to be employed must have a minimum service speed of 11 1/2 knots, hold capacity of approximately 50,000 cu. ft. of which a minimum of 8,000 cu. ft. should be refrigerated and have 'tween decks suitable for the carriage of livestock.

4. The vessel must be registered in Canada, hold the necessary Steamship Inspection Certificate, and comply in all respects with the laws of Canada and be suitable to the requirements of the service.

5. Applicants may submit two tenders, one for a period of one year, and one for a period of three years.

6. All tenders must state the amount of annual subsidy required in each case and must be accompanied by full particulars, a sketch plan and photograph of the vessel to be employed. Tenders should have attached three copies of the proposed freight rates.

7. Forms of tender and further particulars can be obtained upon application to the Canadian Maritime Commission.

The lowest tender, or any tender, will not necessarily be accepted.
