Freight Hikes Evoke Farm Group Criticism

Strong disapproval of the recent increase of 17 per cent in Railway freight rates, was voiced in a resolution passed by the annual meeting of the P. E. I. Federation of Agriculture held this week in Charlottetown.

It was noted in the resolution that freight and express charges make up a large part of farm costs and the extremities of the country are bearing a disproportionate share of freight charges.

The resolution commended the Federal Government for its decision to undertake a complete review of the freight rates structure and asked that the Provincial Government and the Maritime Transportation Commission be supported by the Federation in their efforts to resist such freight increases.

The Federation also took exception to the reclassification of express rates whereby an increase of 50 per cent has been made in regard to the shipment of purebred livestock. The motion said that this increase had been made last spring without the knowledge of the livestock breeders of the Province.

POTATO WEIGHTS
Concern was expressed over the recent complaints regarding short weights of Island potato packages. It was stated that if such a situation does exist, it is injurious to the potato industry.

The resolution felt that the responsibility for checking weights should be clearly established. It was the opinion of the meeting that this responsibility should fall on the potato inspectors. It was also recommended that shippers be required to provide scales for the use of the inspectors. Inspectors were requested to try to prevent rough handling at shipping points.

The Federation expressed disapproval with the pricing policy of Maritime livestock buyers. It was felt that this policy could be changed to provide greater encouragement to producers and greater volume for the packing plants.

It was stated that while the Maritimes are a deficit area in the production of meat, prices paid for cattle and hogs tend to be lower than those paid in Montreal. This it was said, had a tendency to discourage development of the livestock industry in the Maritimes.

A resolution on financing of education urged that the recommendation of the Provincial Education Conference regarding a study of School Tax Structure be carried out.

VERTICAL INTEGRATION
The Federation deplored the practice of "vertical integration" an agreement in which feed and farmers, the packing industry and food stores become operating partners with farmers.

The resolution stated that "vertical integration" can have a crippling effect on the individual farmer by causing over production and it was urged that this subject be studied carefully by farm organizations, the Department of Agriculture and co-operative movements.

The Department of Industry and of Agriculture was strongly urged to pay special attention to the development and supervision of trade with Newfoundland and the Canadian Northland. It was stated that these areas present a growing market for farm products and it was of vital importance that this market be serviced in the best manner possible.

ROADS TO RESOURCES
It was noted that the roads to resources program which is a joint Federal-Provincial project seems to emphasize the importance of the tourist industries and the fisheries. It was felt that a review of this program in the light of servicing agriculture under control.

During the past summer and fall, the presence of wild carrot (Daucus carota L.) was noted in the Hunter River - New Glasgow Rustico area of the province. This weed is very serious in many parts of the Maritimes and an effort should be made to bring this weed under control before it is scattered across the province. The first step might be roadside spraying in certain areas with intensive publicity on this weed that same area.

Ragwort is still an important pasture and hay weed. Very little experimental work has been done on this weed.

WHITE COCKLE
Some time was spent in the area of the Seal River Causeway where an infestation of White Cockerel was found in the ditches and along the roadsides. This weed is a biennial or short-lived perennial, tremendous seed producer, and can stand any amount of competition. Once established it is impossible to control except by clipping to prevent seed production. By hand pulling and mowing, this weed was brought under control for the time being. Other areas in which it has been found are Lower Montague, Tryon, and in the Lot 16 section of Prince County. This particular weed deserves much more attention in the future.

The Ragweed Eradication Program continued during the summer with good results and many new colonies were located. Prince Edward Island is fortunate in having a very limited number of these weeds and every effort should be made to keep it

under control. He said a jail sentence for a second conviction on the charge was mandatory, but some judges were not enforcing that part of the act.

The debentures are expected to be available for delivery on or about Feb. 2.

30 Immigrant Farmers Take Land In N.S.
TRURO (CP) - S. E. Lewis, director of Immigration and Land Settlement Services said Wednesday 30 immigrant farmers were established on Nova Scotia farms in the last eight months of 1958.

Mr. Lewis told the Nova Scotia Federation of Agriculture that about \$300,000 in loans was given the farmers. Previously established immigrants farmers were loaned an additional \$150,000.

Over the past 10 years losses to the board have been nil, he said. Of the few farms that did fail the board was able to sell the property for a sufficient amount to protect their interest.
