

Report Turpin In Top Health

LONDON (AP)—Randolph Turpin is "in excellent physical health" and fit to continue his boxing career, his physician said Tuesday night.

Turpin visited a London specialist Tuesday for a complete physical checkup after losing his European middleweight title to Italy's Tiberio Mitri in Rome nine days ago.

Turpin complained after the fight of blurred vision and said that at times he saw Mitri's in the ring at the same time.

The former world middleweight champion announced after the fight he was quitting as a middleweight and would in future fight as a light-heavyweight.

Hockey Player Suspended Year

DETROIT (AP)—Frank Gallagher, president of the International Hockey League Tuesday suspended Bill Booth of Toledo Mercantile for a year for hitting an official.

The suspension, heaviest in the league's history, can be appealed to the league's board of governors at its next meeting.

Booth was accused of hitting official Elmer Shawley in a playoff game with Johnstown, Pa., last month.

Booth and another Toledo player protested an icing ruling called by Shawley. In the ensuing brawl, Shawley was hurt and could not continue the game. Referee Gordon Parsons imposed a match penalty upon Booth.

Budge Patty Wins Singles Titles At Rome

ROME (AP)—Budge Patty lost an angry dressing room argument, then went out and upset South American Enrique Morea to capture the men's singles championship of the Italian International Tennis Tournament Tuesday.

The former Los Angeles player who now lives in Paris trounced Morea 11-9, 6-4, 6-4, after the Argentine player and tournament officials had rejected Patty's request that the championship match be shortened to two out of three sets.

Before the final match, Patty was forced to play 18 games to complete a semi-final duel with Egypt's Jaroslav Drobny. Patty led Drobny 7-5, 7-5, with the third

TORONTO (CP)—C. H. Millard, Canadian director of the United Steelworkers of America CIO-CCL, says wage talks between the Steel Company of Canada in Hamilton and his union have broken down.

In a statement Monday, he said the wage dispute with the firm has been submitted to conciliation. He said Louis Fine, Ontario's chief conciliator, could not break the

deadlock in five separate sessions. He added that the union's chief aim is to restore parity in wages between base rates paid in the United States and Canada. This parity was lost when the Canadian companies did not follow the U. S. steel industry in granting an 8 1/2-cent-an-hour increase last year.

The Stelco agreement with the union expired April 1.

In addition to an 8 1/2-cent increase in the present basic hourly rate of \$1.43 1/2, the union seeks to have the hourly pay difference between job classifications raised from four cents to 5 1/2 cents, a two-cent hourly increase in shift premiums, additional paid holidays and improved vacations.

Demands are similar at Algoma Steel Corporation at Sault Ste. Marie and at Dominion Steel and Coal Company at Sydney, N. S., where the union also is negotiating new contracts.

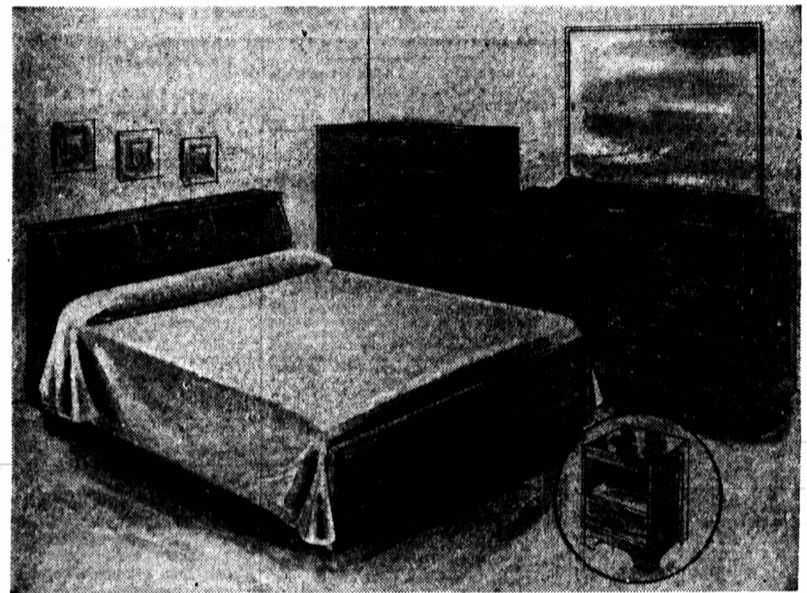
