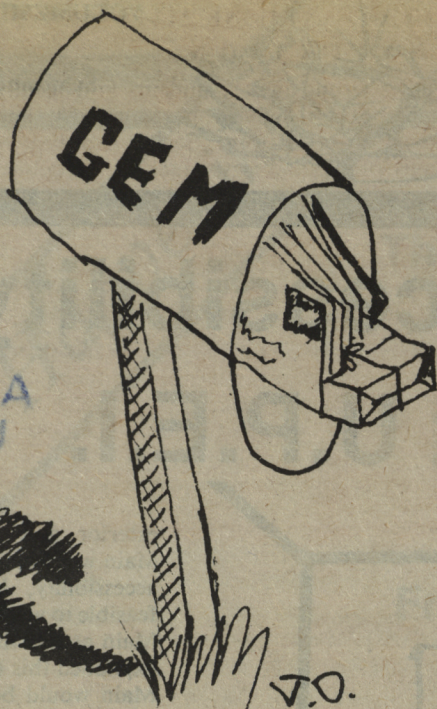

Our Pantherburgers contain only pink panther meat cut from the choicest portion of the animal — guess which part **That is!**

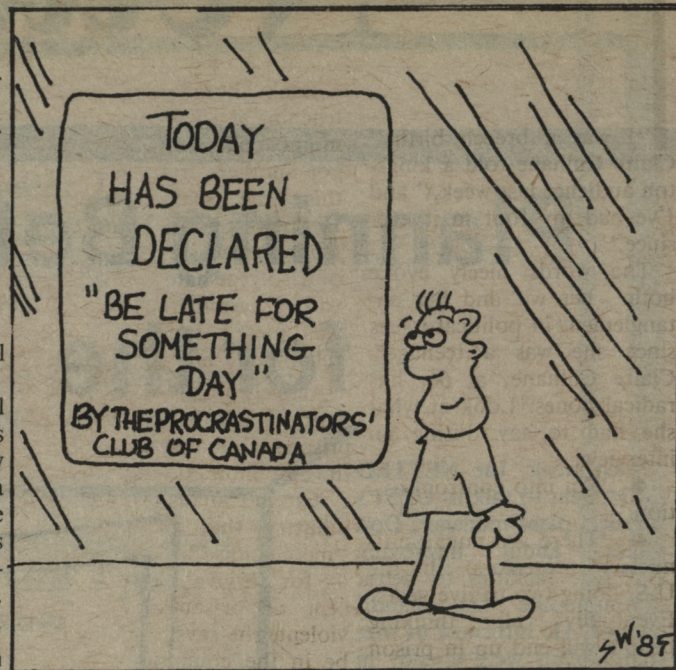
