

### American View Of Canada And Russian Relations

Editor's note: The following column represents an American view of Canadian-Russian relations in connection with External Affairs Minister Pearson's current visit to Moscow.

A torrent of Soviet advice greeted Canada's External Affairs Minister, L. B. Pearson, on his arrival Wednesday in Moscow. The solicited words of Pravda and Izvestia brought into bold relief the aims of the many-pronged Soviet diplomatic offensive.

Izvestia, the Soviet government newspaper, advised Pearson that "deficit trade" with the United States and start taking advantage of the markets offered by the U.S.S.R., Red China and the rest of the Communist bloc.

The Moscow press casually admitted that the Kremlin regards the arrival of Pearson at this moment as most fortunate in view of the "new marked improvement" in East-West relations. It then told Canada that she could sell surplus wheat to Communist countries and reminded her that she has an unfavorable trade balance with the United States.

#### STRIKE AT WEAKNESSES

The Canadian visitor is not the first to undergo this sort of treatment in Moscow since the smile offensive began. The Communists have decided it is high time for them to take advantage of the basic weaknesses of capitalism on the economic front to win more victories on the political front.

Canadians have been treated to a taste of what the new look might amount to. The Canadian government this summer executed a couple of deals with European Communist countries to take ship-

ments of Canada's surplus butter and wheat. Canadian business has been given to understand that this was only the beginning—that an almost limitless market awaits them.

But now, with the visit of the external affairs minister, the implication is that it is all up to the Canadian government and the course of its future policy. Trade requires restoration of normal relations with the Communist bloc—including Red China—and normal relations require an end to the cold war. In order to end the cold war, Canada is given to understand, she must break away from the lead of the United States.

The Russians apparently are thinking it would not take too much of a push to drive a wedge between Ottawa and Washington. Prime Minister St. Laurent and his Liberal party indicate an open mind, for example, on the matter of diplomatic recognition for Red China. The leaders of the Canadian government have hinted at criticism of Washington's China policy and have indicated they would like to see the matter of Formosa settled by secret diplomacy.

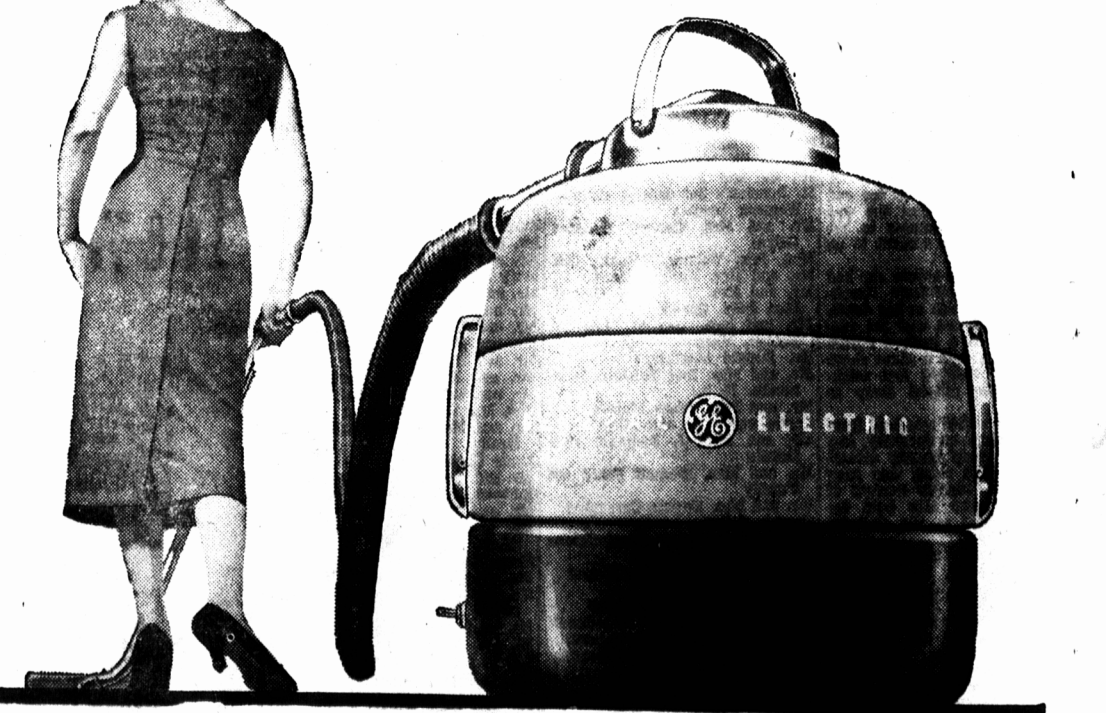
