Russians Shadow Exercise But Little Benefit Seen

LONDON (AP) - Soviet planes, surface ships and submarines shadowed a North Atlantic alliance naval exercise but Western commanders said the Russians would be more of a help than a hindrance.

NATO naval sources had said Monday they hoped to keep the exact area of the Atlantic exercise Team Work a secret from the Russians to prevent the positioning of Soviet observer ships.

No announcement was made of where the exercise would be conducted until most of the

CAN TAG ALONG
The 53-year-old Dublin-born U.S. admiral, whose great-grandmother was Charlotte Nel-

son, Duchess of Bronte, told reporters at a defence ministry briefing:

"The Russians can tag along. If they want to learn something about operating a carrier they could learn a lot from watching the Independence, but they don't have carriers."

The names of the United States, Britain, France, Belgium, Holland, Denmark and Norway are taking part in the exercise which continues until Oct. 2.

INTERCEPT BOMBERS
Two Crusader jet fighters from the U.S. aircraft carrier Independence intercepted two Soviet Blon bombers and escorted them out of the area. The U.S. and Soviet pilots waved to each other as they flew side by side. The Soviet planes were spotted 100 miles away from the Independence and never got closer than 35 miles.

Admiral Kiebas S. Masterson, U.S. commander of the NATO striking fleet, said there is no intention of avoiding the Russian forces and that "we plan to utilize them as part of the exercise."

Rear Admiral Horace R. Law, descendant of Britain's naval hero Lord Nelson, said:

"We reckon we learn more from them having them round than they do from us."

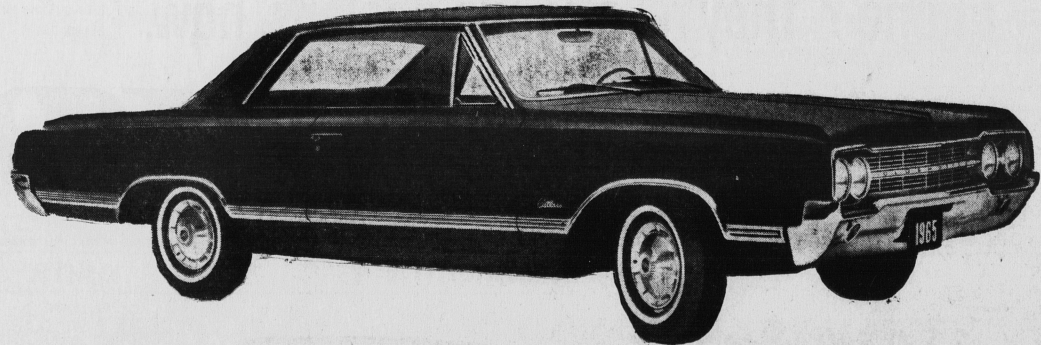
New Printing Process Found
