Heartbreaking Tragedy And Epic In Failure Is Reported From Korea

WITH U.S. TASK FORCE 77 IN KOREAN WATERS, April 14—(AP)—Heartbreaking tragedy and an epic in failure followed young ensign Marvin Bromhead after he took off from the aircraft carrier Valley Forge and roared over Communist Korea to blast a bridge. It was not his day and his plane was destroyed by enemy fire. In a crash landing among mountains Bromhead was severely injured and pinned in the plane. His mates concluded that he had been killed but 10 minutes later they saw him crawl painfully onto the crashed wing. His legs had been broken and he collapsed as enemy gunners began to draw a bead on him.
