**MONTREAL, June 28 (CP)—**Egg prices rose about one cent on open produce markets here today while potato and cheese offerings fell back narrowly. The Dominion Department of Agriculture reported. Butter prices were a little firmer.  
Creamery butter prints to retailers sold for 22 1/2-23 cents a pound and 22-22 1/2 Western butter delivered in Montreal was unquoted. Quebec No. 1 pasteurized in wholesale jobbing lots made 21 1/2-4.  
Ontario white cheese sold for 13 cents a pound and colored for 12 1/8-1. Quebec white traded for 12 1/2 and colored for 12 5/8.  
Graded egg shipments in used free cases were offered at 24-24 1/2 cents a dozen for A-grade; 21-22 cents a dozen for B-grade; and 15-15 1/2 for C.

**Livestock**

**MONTREAL, June 28 (CP)—**Receipts on Montreal livestock markets today were three cattle, 31 calves, 110 hogs and four sheep. All classes of livestock were steady. There were not enough cattle and sheep to make a market.  
Good veals made \$7.50 with tops up to \$8 with medium kinds selling up to \$7, and common light veals down to \$5. Grassers and light drinkers were mostly \$4.50 to \$4.75.  
Hogs were firm. Today's sales were made on a rail grade basis at \$13.50 for bacon cold weight.  
In Maritime markets, rail grade hogs advanced 30 cents to 312.10 warm weight. Live grade hogs advanced 30 cents to \$9.05. Sows remained unchanged at \$5.15 live grade and \$6.85 rail grade.  
Steers and heifers were mostly 25 cents higher. Cows were unchanged. Choice steers were \$6.75, good \$5.25, medium \$5.50, fair unchanged at \$4.75 and common \$4.25. Cows heifers were \$6.25, good \$5.75, medium \$5, fair \$4.50 and common \$4. Top cows brought \$5, good \$4.50, medium \$4, fair \$3 to \$3.50, and canners and cutters \$2 to \$3. Boning bulls were \$3 to \$3.25 and butcher bulls \$3.25 to \$4-25.  
Veal calves brought \$3.75 to \$5 with grassers from \$2.50 to \$3.50.
