Records Shattered At Queens Meet Sat.

Queen County students gave outstanding performances in the annual County track and field meet at Charlottetown's Memorial Field Saturday. Four provincial records were broken during the day. Don MacClintock of Birchwood High set a new mark in the 100-yard dash for boys 14 years with a record breaking time of 11 seconds. Two other Birchwood students shattered provincial marks. Jack MacEachern set a new distance mark of 48 feet 10 1/2 inches in the boys 48 pound shot and Mary MacLeod shattered the record of the girls 50 lb shot event with a toss of 151 feet.
