Son Of Diplomat Is Fed Up, Walks Through Wall To West

BERLIN (AP)—Polish diplomat's son, who said he is fed up with the "unbearable life under communism," walked from East Berlin through the Communist wall early in May and defected to the West. U.S. officials reported here.

The 21-year-old son of the Polish military mission here defected Sunday.

Marek Radomski, 19, made his way to West Berlin May 5, using a diplomatic passport to pass through the East German Communist border controls at the wall dividing East and West Berlin.

He is the son of the economic counsellor at the Polish embassy in East Berlin. He is reported to have attempted to change his mind and return.

Immediately after his defection became known here, rumors circulated that Radomski was the son of a former marriage of "Ladislaw Tykocinski, chief of the Polish military mission in West Berlin who asked the United States for political asylum Sunday.

U.S. officials said there is no family connection between the youth and the defected diplomat, who held the rank of minister which is equivalent to a major-general.

But authoritative sources said it could not be discounted that Tykocinski, who has described himself as a "socialist but not a communist," was under severe pressure by the Polish foreign office because of his failure to engineer the youth's return.

Warsaw, meanwhile, Poland publicly accused Tykocinski, defected chief of the Polish mission in West Berlin, of committing "an act of treachery against the state."

The Polish government has

firmly protested to American authorities against the attitude taken by U.S. officials in West Berlin toward the act of Tykocinski, PAP, the Polish press agency, which speaks for the government, declared.

Radomski reported to U.S. military policemen at Checkpoint Charlie, the wall crossing point used by non-Germans and diplomats, and requested political asylum.

U.S. authorities were said to have arranged a meeting between Radomski and Polish officials to satisfy the Poles that the youth's defection was entirely voluntary.

He also was allowed to talk by telephone to his mother, who pleaded with him to return. It was reported, Radomski remained firm in his decision to stay in the West.

U.S. officials said Radomski is in the care of American authorities in West Germany. He was reported to have been granted political asylum in West Germany.

Canada Aims At Boosting China Trade

Ottawa (CP)—Trade Minister Sharp said here that the government will establish trade offices, if necessary, to ensure that the huge market potential of China is developed to its maximum.

Alvin Hamilton (PC—Quebec) asked whether the government was considering having the Chinese government establish a trade office in Canada, similar to offices already established in France, Argentina and Chile.

Mr. Sharp said he is "very anxious" that Canada maintain to the full her trade relations with China. And if this includes establishing a trade office, "I can assure" Mr. Hamilton "that this will be done."

The whole question of relations with China, political as well as economic, remained under constant consideration.

QUIZ

You are the dealer, neither side vulnerable, and have opened One Diamond Partner responds One Heart. What would you bid now with each of the following five hands?

- ♠KQ3 ♣QJ72 ♠AK62 ♣A9
- ♠7 ♣K53 ♠AQ72 ♠AQ84
- ♠AQ95 ♣Q83 ♠AKQ74 ♠65
- ♠KQ82 ♣A8 ♠KQJ983 ♠7
- ♠AQ9 ♣74 ♠AQJ5 ♠AK85

1. Four hearts. You can't afford to play this hand for less than game, since it is mighty difficult to imagine partner losing four tricks. The jump to four hearts is not regarded as a closing bid, on the contrary, it shows about 20 points, since the one heart response does not guarantee more than six points.

It would be dangerous to raise to only three hearts, which partner, with minimum values, is allowed to pass. The jump to four is more accurate for both game and slam purposes.

2. Three hearts. While the high-card point count here is only 15, the good trump support and the singleton spade raise the value of the hand to approximately 18 points and make it clear that a raise to two hearts would be inadequate.

Partner is not obligated to bid again over three hearts, but the feeling should be that, if he
