Where happy people thank God for the spring.

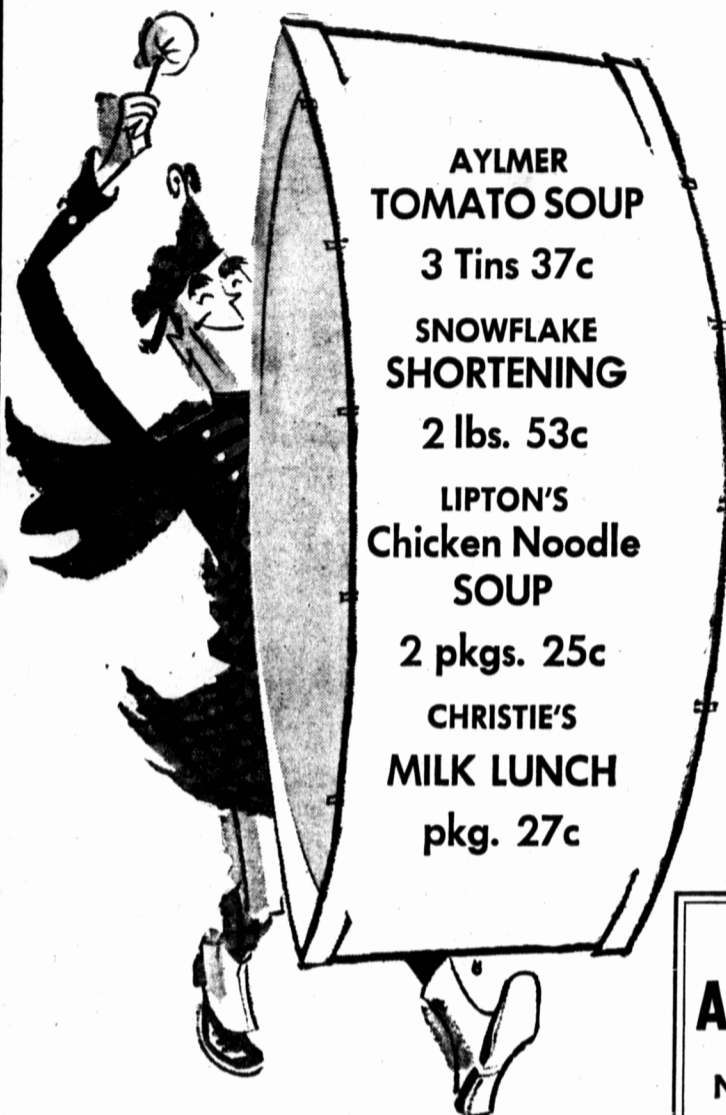

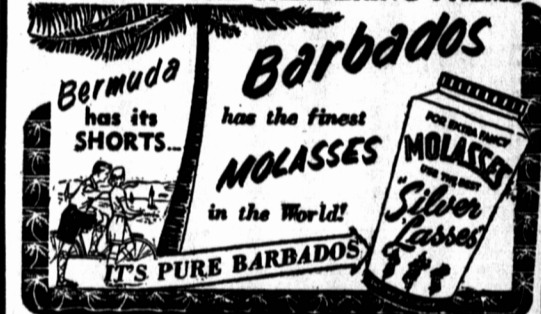

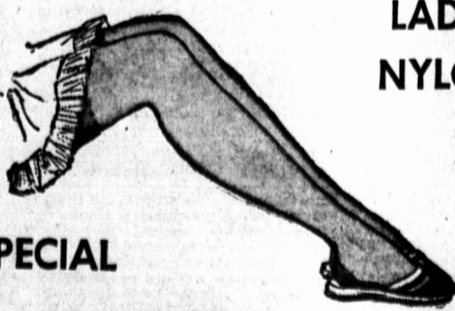
