Indianapolis Race Scheduled For Today

INDIANAPOLIS (AP) — A \$500,000 purse and a battle for racing survival by the old-fashioned front engine and roadsters await 33 entries in the 48th Indianapolis 500-mile auto race today. An expected 550,000—a mass blending of racing buffs, morbidly curious and Memorial Day picnickers — may see the famed race's first foreign winner in 48 years, but rear-engine triumph in history, and a speedway record for the sixth straight year. Generally favored is Scotland's Jimmy Clark, world road racing champion and the record breaking qualifier in one of seven rear-engine Ford entries. Clark won the pole position with a four-lap 138.828 miles an hour over the 2½-mile asphalt oval. In a surprising vote Friday, writers and broadcasters established Bobby Meacham of Pottstown, Pa., as the favorite. CLARK CHOSEN SECOND Fourteen voted for Marshallman and 10 votes went to Clark. Others getting votes were Roger Ward, Indianapolis; P. A. J. Foyt, Houston; T. Parnell Jones, Torrance, Calif.; and Bobby Unser, Albuquerque, N.M. I. The Ford-powered contenders along with five other rear-engine models, will challenge 18 front-engine Offenhausers — the conventional four-cylinder roadster, which is seeking an 18th successive speedway victory. The race, which starts about 11 a.m. EDT, is expected to end about 3 p.m. Sunny skies and temperatures in the mid-70s are forecast. Only once in 1915 did rain postpone the event. Jones is the standard-bearer of the old Offy guard, driving on the inside of the second of the 11 three-car rows in the

Major league Baseball Action

NEW YORK (AP)—The New York Mets' hitters for 6 1/3 innings by Jack Sanford, erupted for four runs in the seventh inning. The duo on Jim Hickman's home run, and downed the San Francisco Giants 4-2 Friday night. A crowd of 35,062, largest in Shea Stadium's brief history, saw Willie Mays nearly make a sensational catch on a 400-foot smash by Frank Thomas, which went for a triple and broke up Sanford's no-hit bid in the seventh.

Mays leaped against the left-center field wall with his back to the field, and got his glove on the ball but fell on his back, catching his spikes under the fence. Bill Hall on his back, Mays flipped the ball toward the infield, but Rod Kanehl scored and Thomas reached third.

Tracy Stallard limited the Giants to four hits, but walked six batters in winning his third game against six defeats. The only base runner against Sanford before the seventh was Hickman, who reached first on Jim Hart's double. The Giants right-hander then retired the next 13 batters before he walked Kanehl.

PHILS NIP COLTS PHILADELPHIA (AP)—Roy Sievers' run-scoring double made a triple by Cookie Rojas, his taste of competition on opening day. Mt. Wills and Tommy Davis each stole second in the seventh when the Dodgers scored their fourth run.
