NOT YET TAKEN.

The White Flag is Still Flying.

THE COMMANDERS ARE AWAITING FURTHER ORDERS.

Suffering and Destitution Increasing Day by Day.

[SPECIAL TO THE EXAMINER.]

AT THE FRONT, Santiago, July 7.—Firing was not resumed today although the truce is supposed to be ended.

Both armies have been informed that Washington and Madrid are negotiating terms of peace.

The white flag still flies over Santiago.

There have been no messages nor flags of truce between the commanders since 3 o'clock yesterday afternoon, when Hobson and his man were exchanged.

The news from Santiago is to the effect that suffering increases daily.

There is much destitution as well as hunger at El Caney where thousands of refugees from Santiago are now quartered with the soldiers at the front.

At Shafter's headquarters the foreign consuls are still consulting with General Shafter.
