TO PURIFY SEWAGE THE WASTES OF CITIES.

The Important Work of Cultivating Microbes for the Destruction of the Noxious Properties of Organic Bodies.

An ingenious as well as scientific method of treating sewage is now being fully tested in England. The system, which is the invention of Mr. Scott-Moncrieff, seeks to exist on the side of sewage purification those forces in nature which possess vital energy, and which are represented in this instance by the generally abhorred army of microbes.

Ducts teeming with these minute creatures, mankind would long ago have perished from the face of the earth. Unquestionably there are microbes which possess the power of propagating a direful class of diseases. But these creatures are comparatively rare, and the microbes which are beneficial serve to destroy them. The nonpathogenic or harmless bacteria are not only antagonistic to those that are harmful, but are equally valuable as "nature's scavengers."

In a recent report on the system by Dr. Alexander H. Brown, of Edinburgh, quoted by London Engineer, the part played by the liquefying organisms is described as sufficiently obvious. They produce in the ground a mass capable of peptonizing organic matter, and so are able directly or indirectly to effect the breaking up of the complex organic bodies constituting the sewage into the simple elements of the sewage, the effect being to prepare the material, by a process resembling that of digestion, for its final disintegration.

Recognizing these principles Mr. Scott-Moncrieff has so applied them as to constitute a plan for the bacteriological treatment of sewage. The main feature of the apparatus is that of a filter bed, which is intended to act also in the cultivation of the microbes, and is therefore a "cultivation filter-bed." The operation, so far as present information goes, is limited to the treatment of the sewage from a single house, though fresh materials for investigations are now coming to hand from a town where the "cultivation filter-bed" is at work. These latter facts will be published as soon as possible.

Dr. Houston states the results which have been obtained on a smaller scale at Ashstead. The Ashstead filter-bed is simply 10 feet in length, by 2 feet in width, and 3 feet in height. This receives the entire sewage discharge from a household of 10 or 12 persons, with the exception of the grease, which is held back as far as possible by a grease trap. The filtration is upward, the liquid rising through a false bottom, and then passing through a series of layers of sand, coke and gravel, till it reaches the level of the outflow pipe. The depth of the filtering material is only about 14 inches.

It might be expected that so small a filter would soon become choked, and that the material would be created. But Dr. Houston states that the reverse of this happens, the effluent up to a certain point actually improving in quality as it passes through the filter. This is due to the beneficial action of nonpathogenic micro-organisms, which peptonize the organic matter in the sewage, and so bring about its purification.

Practical Results of Importance. Recently a nitrifying channel, 80 feet in length, was started, and was filled with coke down to within the last 8 feet, where coarse gravel took its place. The contents of the filter-bed were also moderately heated by means of hot water pipes. As had been anticipated, the effluent was greatly improved in quality, and became remarkably clear.

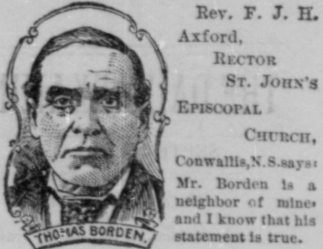
All the experiments possess a certain scientific value, and may be expected to yield practical results of importance as affecting isolated houses, or small groups of dwellings. The system may be treated of as a preliminary step towards the treatment of sewage on a large scale. Mr. Scott-Moncrieff is throwing great light on a reconside part of the sewage question, and is thereby rendering a valuable service. From the small beginning, having the nucleus of truth a great advance may be made in course of time.

Dr. Charcot's Life. Prof. Charcot, the celebrated specialist in mental and nervous diseases, of the Salpêtrière Hospital, whose death has been announced, was one of the most notable figures in Paris. Of a cast of features which recalled the Napoleon, he was extremely quiet in manner and sentences in speech. Having been appointed to the Salpêtrière in 1862, he spent the rest of his life there, and was what was once a huge porphyreous for male incurables into a hospital and school, where the most brilliant discoveries and most patient and exhaustive researches have been made under his direction in the pathology and treatment of nervous diseases. Charcot married a rich wife, and lived in a splendid mansion in the Boulevard St. Germain. The house is full of fine old furniture, and Charcot himself was no mean artist, and his cabinet service was ornamented with paintings of a serene character, taken from his tourist sketch books. Charcot himself was from all parts of the world to consult the professor, he reserved three days a week for study and research. Many of his students have attained high positions in their profession. He was born in Paris in 1825. Apropos of an article by Tolstol, Dr. Charcot wrote a couple of years ago: "Alcohol and tobacco are injurious, but they can be used in moderation."

Suicide statistics, as recently published by an English doctor, show that taking the entire population of the world as a basis, there is an attempt made every three minutes on an average by some one to take his own life. It seems that Saxony is the quarter of the globe where suicide is the most popular, the ratio there being 369 suicides in 1,000,000 deaths. Portugal on the other hand, occupies the first place for infrequency of self-destruction, the proportion there being only sixteen to 1,000,000.
