Pay Television May Close After 5-Year Losing Run

TORONTO (CP) — Pay television service in suburban Etobicoke, first such operation in the world, is reported set to close after a five-year test which cost backers an estimated \$15,000,000.

Newspaper reports here say plans are afoot to move the Trans-Canada Telemeter operation to Montreal with the possibility of joining forces with Cable TV Limited, a 12-year-old system that carries the programs of United States TV stations into 25,000 homes in west Montreal.

Both Trans-Canada Telemeter and Cable TV Limited are controlled by Famous Players Canadian Corporation and its U.S. parent, Paramount Pictures Corporation.

Telemeter began its Etobicoke experiment Feb. 26, 1960, piping mainly new movies and sports events, including National Hockey League games, into subscription homes by wire.

Initially, subscribers paid a \$5 installation fee and fed a coin box with between \$1 and \$2 for each show they wished to see on a special TV channel. In July, 1962, an additional annual fee of \$15 was added.

Peak subscription was 5,200 but it now is down to about 2,000. Proposals to extend the service to other homes in the Toronto area never were carried out.

More than 300 cable or community TV companies in Canada, a number of them controlled by Famous Players Corporation, now serve more than 250,000 homes. Many of them pipe in the products of U.S. television stations and distribute them for a fee, raising protests from Canadian broadcasters against competition without regulation by the Board of Broadcast Governors.

Joey Claims False Data In Article

ST. JOHN'S, Nfld. (CP) — Premier Smallwood in the legislature has condemned an article in Time magazine as containing false passages.

The article in the March 19 Canadian edition dealt with the issues in transmission of surplus power from Churchill Falls Hydro project in Labrador to eastern Canada and the United States.

Power would be carried by land and under-water lines across Labrador, the Strait of Belle Isle, and Newfoundland to

the Cabot Strait, then to the Maritimes and eastern U.S.

Mr. Smallwood said the Time article wrote that Cabot Strait contains a huge trench that plunges to 200 fathoms. He said the trench does not plunge, but rather inclines from the shore line at each end.

He also disputed Time's statement the bottom of the strait is "plugged by submarine silt and mud floods."

The premier said the silt on the bottom of the strait is an advantage in that the cable would be protected after it worked its way in and became buried. Mud floods were an "imaginative fabrication."

ECM JOINS FAIR
 MONTREAL (CP) — The European Common Market has become the first international organization to agree to participate in the Montreal world's fair in 1967, it was announced Wednesday. A statement from Expo headquarters said the main European economic community, along with its two specialized organizations, the European atomic energy community and European steel and coal community will sponsor a joint pavilion at the exhibition.

Montreal Seen Sure To Become All-Year Port

MONTREAL (CP) — Maurice Rinfret, federal Liberal member for Montreal-St. Jacques, said here winter navigation on the St. Lawrence River will continue to grow until Montreal becomes a truly year-around port.

He told a gathering of local stevedores ship design had improved to the point where vessels now require ice-breaking assistance in winter only in the most severe cases.

Industrial development along the St. Lawrence added to the need for year-around access to ports in Montreal, Trois-Rivières and Quebec. It is "only

natural" anyway that Montreal, as the metropolis of Canada, should have harbor facilities open 12 months a year.

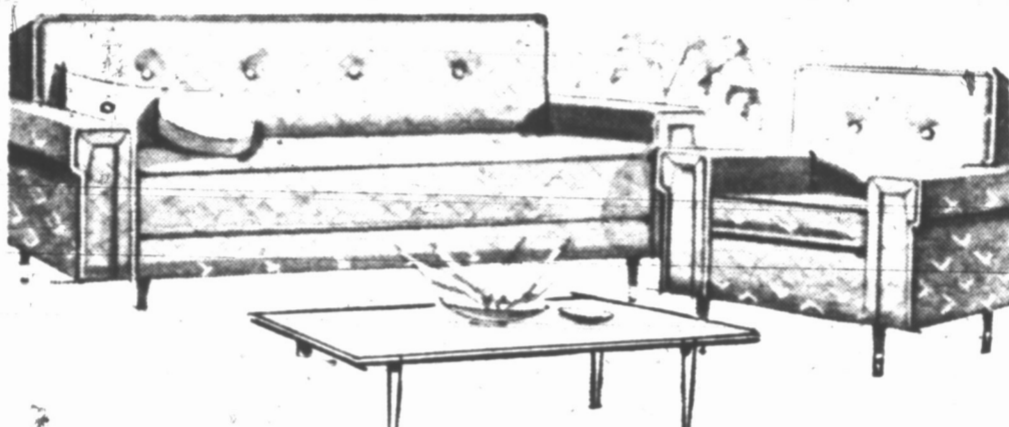
