SOME HELPFUL HUNTS

Don't allow stress to mar your beauty

In order to have the most glow match the inner glow, the bride-to-be, in the strain of pre-wedding forces, should start her beauty routine about three weeks ahead of the wedding.

To bring her skin to its best and bid adieu to signs of weariness, she should have a facial and follow it up with two more before the wedding day.

Experiment with cosmetics ahead of time, try a moisture cream before applying make-up, or a foundation when beds mauldrier in its formula. This will erase rickles, signs of fatigue, and set a lovely glow. Experiment also with lipstick colors, rouges and foundations to find the most flattering shade.

Three weeks ahead of the day get a permanent and have hair styled. A simple coiffure will look best, but be sure it can be done with the wedding head-dress. The day before the wedding do not use hair cream or treatment with a new hair style.

On the day before the ceremony have a facial, a hair massage, a moisture, a pedicure, less waxed and shampoo a 3 set.

Delicate, have the hair-dresser come to your home on the wedding day for a comb out. Have a hair massage and do your own make-up.

Delicate, never harsh colors are best for a bride. Makeup color tones should be light and soft. — use the kind that lasts best, because it has to stay on several hours. A bridal veil, bride's veil has no other use than for the veil. The veil should be made as it looks in the store and especially in church.

For eye makeup, iridescent eyeshadow should be carefully and lightly over the lids, and give a charming effect. Large brows and lashes need a bit of darkening with pencil and mascara. The former applied with feathery strokes, the latter lightly.

ROMANTIC PERFUME

Perfume should be romantic and feminine. If it is something new it should be selected with care and imagination.

The bride's hands are also the centre of attraction. Polish worn on the day should be light and blend with cosmetics and coloring.

For photography, a tanned or dark-skinned bride should use lighter makeup than usual. The total makeup should be balanced, because too much emphasis on one feature detracts from the total effectiveness. Work systems, however, does nothing for the scarier. After marriage a few strategic techniques can make beauty care less arduous.

SOAPINGS BEST

Natural looking beauty can be best preserved with soap. A daily soap facial is recommended. Wash and rinse neck to remove surface grime and stale makeup. Then massage on a sea on a thick layer, foam through in hairline area several motions. Rinse well and pat dry.

INSURE HAPPINESS

Orange blossoms, usually attached to the veil and/or carried in her bouquet, were thought by the Saxons to insure happiness and good fortune.



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Reception details require attention

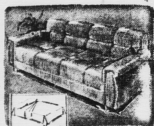
