Still later, a despatch comes, announcing a settled bombardment on the Alexandrian plan if the forts do not surrender before Monday.

A rumor is prevalent here that Arabi has proposed terms to the British. His conditions are, voluntary exile and retention of rank for himself, and for nine of his colleagues.

Small Pox in Winnipeg.

OTTAWA, July 29. The remains of an immense whale have been discovered at Smith's Falls about twenty-eight miles inland from the St. Lawrence.

Sir Charles Tupper, to-day, signed a contract in New York for the construction of the Nova Scotia Section of the European and American Short Line Railway.

Much excitement is caused in Winnipeg over the outbreak of some very bad cases of small-pox. The disease was brought in by some of the emigrants.

DUBLIN, July 27. A desperate but unsuccessful attempt was made to assassinate the Recorder of Dublin, at Green Street Court House.

A tremendous conflagration broke out in Alexandria at two o'clock this morning. As seen from the harbor, the fire seemed to be larger than any since the bombardment.

An official telegram from the rebel government, dated Cairo, July 26th, says: "Armenians continue on an extensive scale. Volunteers are arriving from Upper and Lower Egypt."

The Egyptian soldiers at Aboukir refused to embark upon the "Charkish." At last reports the flag of truce was still flying there.

As the vessel was leaving Aboukir a train was seen carrying troops into the forts.

LONDON, July 27. In the Commons, this afternoon, an address, thanking the Queen for calling out the reserves, was approved without division.

The Commons again adjourned without reaching a division on the motion for a vote of credit for the force of Egypt.
