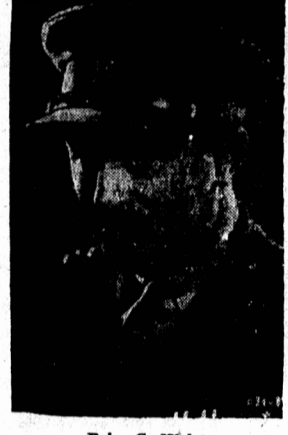
Four Missing Communist Leaders Sought In The U.S.

OTTAWA, July 2 (CP) — Canon G. P. Woolcombe, 84, founder of the Capital's Ashbury College, a private school, died today. He was perhaps equally well known for his trans-Atlantic voyages. Last year he completed his 80th crossing. In 1939, when he was 72, he took to a lifeboat from the Athenia, torpedoed 200 miles from Ireland with more than 100 people lost. The sea-going Anglican clergyman founded Ashbury College in 1891.
